**N**OTICE is hereby given that the Commissioners of the Waste Lands Board will sit at the Land Office, Christchurch, on Wednesday, the 1st day of May next, at 10 a.m., to receive Pasturage License Fees, under the Land Regulations of the 1st April, 1856.

Licensees of runs, situate between the Rangitata and the Waitangi, will be required

to pay 14s. per 1000 acres, being the moiety of the cost of the survey of their runs; and all licensees are required to make returns of the stock on their respective runs, for which printed forms may be obtained at the Land Office.

By clause 51 of the Amended Land Regulations, Pasturage License Fees may be paid on any sitting day of the Board, between the 20th April and the 1st May.
