## BANKS PENINSULA.

WOOD, THOMAS, Purau.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room, or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting room.
2. Not less than six beds for travellers in not less than three separate bedrooms.
3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather tight and fit for the accommodation of at least four horses.
5. To keep at all times a proper supply of oats and oaten or grass hay.
8. To keep a lamp burning with two burners from sunset to sunrise, giving a sufficiently bright light, and being so lighted as to be conspicuous from a distance from the house.

Conditions 4, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15 and 16, same as William Weeden's, noted below.

6, 7, 9 and 13, nil.

SHADBOLT, BENJAMIN, "Traveller's Rest," head of Akaroa Harbour.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room, or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting-room.
2. Not less than six beds for travellers in not less than four separate bedrooms.
3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight and fit for the accommodation of at least two horses.

4, 5, 8, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15 and 16, same as Weeden's, noted below.

6, 7, and 9, nil.

13. To keep at all times a safe ferry boat (punt) in good working order and ready for conveyance of passengers between the town of Akaroa and the head of the harbour, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. in summer, and between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. in winter. The fare for passengers to be 5s. each for single passengers, 3s. 6d. for each passenger when more than one. Officers of Supreme Court, Magistrates, and police constables on duty and prisoners to be ferried free of charge. The word constables not to include bailiffs or persons serving civil process.

## BETWEEN THE HURUNUI AND ASHBURTON RIVERS.

WEEDEN, WILLIAM, the "Half-Way House," Great South Road.

## CONDITIONS.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and two private sitting-rooms.
2. Not less than thirteen beds for travellers, in not less than four separate bedrooms.
3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather tight and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.
4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house and for horses and cattle.
5. To keep at all times a proper supply of oats and oaten or grass hay: oats to be charged for to travellers at not more than 6d. per quart measure.
6. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient stockyard for cattle, capable of holding not less than 50 head.
7. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient moveable sheep-proof enclosure, capable of holding not less than 2000 sheep: or, at the option of the licensee, to keep one acre of land enclosed by a permanent sheep-proof fence.
8. To keep a lamp burning with two burners from sunset to sunrise, giving a sufficiently bright light, and being so lighted as to be conspicuous from a distance all round the house.
9. Nil.
10. To be sworn in, and to act as a constable, especially when required by the Magistrates or the police.
11. On all occasions to render every assistance, and to supply information to Magistrates and to the police in the execution of their duty.
12. To keep a clean and orderly house, and to render it as comfortable for the accommodation of travellers as the circumstances of position and distance from town will fairly allow.
13. Nil.

14. The licence to be cancelled if any of the conditions of the licence be not fulfilled regularly, or if any drunkenness be proved to have been allowed on the premises, or if any spirits shall be supplied from the house or premises to any aboriginal native of New Zealand.
15. A printed or fairly written copy of the conditions to be kept at all times posted up in some conspicuous place, in the tap room, in the public and in the private sitting room, for the information of travellers.
16. A tariff of charges to be kept posted up in like manner.

SHAKSPERE, EDMUND, the Halswell River.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the taproom or room answering as such, one public sitting room.
  2. Not less than four beds for travellers, in not less than two separate bed rooms.
  3. Weather tight sheds for at least two horses.
  6. To provide and keep in good repair a good and sufficient stockyard for yoking up cattle.

17. If all the required accommodation be not properly provided within six months from this date, the licence to stand void.

  2. Not less than 25 beds for travellers, in not less than 15 separate bed-rooms.
  3. A shed sufficiently weather-tight, fit for the accommodation of at least eight horses.

WHITE, CHARLES, The Waimakariri, "White's Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, beside the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting-room.
  2. Not less than ten beds for travellers in not less than four separate bed-rooms.
  3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, fit for accommodation of at least six horses.

- 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, as in Weeden's.

NEWTON, ROBERT, and VINCENT, WILLIAM. The Rakaia. "Dunford's Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and two private sitting-rooms. Also, to provide a separate room and special and proper accommodation for female travellers.
  2. Not less than twenty beds for travellers, in not less than twelve separate bed-rooms.
  3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight and fit for the accommodation of at least 20 horses.
  8. Nil.
  9. Not to keep a lamp burning at night outside the house.

13. Conditions regarding the Ferry over the Rakaia to stand as per special contract with the Provincial Government, dated 19th July, 1860, and especially the licensees shall keep a ferry-boat or boats to be used upon the river Rakaia, the gear and all necessary fittings to render the same serviceable to be always maintained in good order and repair. Officers of the Supreme Court, magistrates, and police constables on duty, and prisoners to be ferried free of charge. The licensees to afford every assistance in their power in directing strangers to a safe fording across the river.

TURTON, WILLIAM, the "Ashburton Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, beside the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and two private sitting rooms.

2. Not less than 15 beds for travellers, in not less than six separate bedrooms.
3. A shed weather-tight, to accommodate ten horses.
- 4, 5, 6, 7, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16 as Weeden's.
8. To keep a lamp burning with two burners from sunset to sunrise, giving a sufficiently bright light and being so lighted as not to be visible on the South bank of the the Ashburton.
13. If required, to accompany foot passengers and horsemen across the river at a charge not exceeding one shilling for a foot passenger and not exceeding sixpence each for horsemen, and persons driving drays or other vehicles at a charge not exceeding one shilling for each dray or vehicle. Officers of Supreme Court, magistrates, and police constables on duty, and prisoners to be put across the river free of charge. To afford every assistance in his power in directing strangers to a safe fording.
17. If the *improvements required* in order to fulfil conditions Nos. 1, 2, 3, 6, 7 shall not be *all completed* within *three months* from this date this licence shall then stand void and of none effect.

REDFERN, SALATHIEL, Oxford, "Redfern's Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, beside the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting-room.
  2. Not less than twelve beds for travellers in not less than six separate bedrooms.
  3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.
- 9 and 13 nil.  
4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16 as in Weeden's.

CAMERON, DONALD and DUNCAN, the Saltwater Creek.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, beside the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting-room.
  2. Not less than 15 beds for travellers, in not less than seven separate bedrooms.
  3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least seven horses.
- 4, 5, 6, 8, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, same as Weeden's.
7. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient moveable sheep-proof enclosure, capable of holding not less than 500 sheep; or at the option of the licensee, to keep one acre of land enclosed by a permanent sheep-proof fence.

9. Nil.

13. To keep at all times a safe ferry-boat in good working order and ready for conveyance of passengers across the Saltwater Creek, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. in summer and winter. The fare for foot passengers to be 1d. each between the hours above named. The fares to be doubled at all other times. Officers of the Supreme Court, magistrates and police constables on duty and prisoners to be ferried free of charge. To afford every assistance in his power in directing strangers to a safe fording.

LEGGETT, JOHN, Accommodation House, Brown's Bridge, Saltwater Creek.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room, or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting-room.
  2. Not less than eight beds for travellers, in not less than four separate bedrooms.
  3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.
- 4, 5, 8, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16 as Weeden's.  
9 and 13, nil.
6. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient stockyard for yoking up cattle.
  7. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient moveable sheep-proof enclosure, capable of holding not less than 500 sheep; or, at the option of the licensee, to keep one acre of land enclosed by a permanent sheep-proof fence.
17. This licence to have no effect whatsoever until the Sub-Inspector of Police at Kaiapoi shall have endorsed upon it that the premises are all completed, and that the conditions can all be fully complied with by the licensee.

LEITH, JOHN, Accommodation House, south bank of the Kowai.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room, or room answering thereto, one public and one private sitting room.
  2. Not less than ten beds for travellers, in not less than seven separate bedrooms.
  3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.
- 4, 5, 8, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, as Weeden's.  
9 and 13, nil.
6. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient stockyard for yoking up cattle.

7. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient moveable sheep-proof enclosure, capable of holding not less than 500 sheep; or, at the option of the licensee, to keep one half acre of land enclosed by a permanent sheep-proof fence.

WARD, JOSEPH, the Weka Pass.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room, or room answering thereto, one public and one private sitting-room.
2. Not less than seven beds for travellers, in not less than six separate bed-rooms.
3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.
- 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, as Weeden's.
- 9 and 13, nil.

HASTIE, JOHN, Accommodation House, south bank of the Hurunui.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair; to provide, besides the tap room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting room.
2. Not less than eight beds for travellers, in not less than four separate bed rooms.
3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather tight and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.
- 4, 5, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, as Weeden's.
6. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient stockyard for yoking up cattle.
- 7 and 9 nil.
8. To keep a lamp burning with two, burners from sunset to sunrise giving a sufficiently bright light, and being so lighted as not to be visible from the northern bank of the Hurunui.
13. To keep at all times a horse for conveyance of foot passengers across the Hurunui during the hours of daylight in summer and winter at a moderate charge. Officers of the Supreme Court, magistrates and police constables on duty and prisoners to be ferried free of charge. To afford every assistance in his power in directing strangers to a safe fording.
17. The conditions respecting the extent of the accommodation will not be stringently enforced by the Bench, until it shall appear to be necessary, owing to increased traffic after completion of the proposed main road to Nelson passing close by the house.

BETWEEN THE ASHBURTON AND WAITANGI—TIMARU DISTRICT.

FITCH, JAMES SAWYER, River Pareora, "Pareora Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house besides the tap room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting room.
2. Not less than eleven beds for travellers, in not less than four separate bed rooms.
3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least six horses.
4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house and for horses and cattle.
5. To keep at all times a proper supply of oats and oaten or grass hay, oats to be charged for to travellers at not more than 6d. per imperial quart measure, and to provide himself with an imperial quart measure.
6. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient stockyard for cattle, capable of holding not less than 50 head.
7. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient moveable sheep-proof enclosure, capable of holding not less than 2000 sheep; or, at the option of the licensee, to keep one acre of land enclosed by a permanent sheep-proof fence.
8. To keep a lamp burning with two burners from sunset to sunrise, giving a sufficiently bright light, and being so lighted as to be conspicuous from a distance all round the house.
9. Nil.
10. To be sworn in and act as a constable, especially when required by the magistrates or the police.

GIBBS, GEORGE, Accommodation House, the Point.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public sitting-room.
2. Not less than six beds in not less than two separate bed-rooms.

The remaining conditions, Nos. 3 and following, are the same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

MARSHALL, ROBERT, River Rangitata, (south bank).

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public sitting-room.

2. Not less than six beds, in not less than two separate bed-rooms.

3, and 4. Same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

5. To keep at all times a proper supply of oats and oaten or grass hay. Oats to be charged for to travellers at not more than 9d. per imperial quart measure, and to provide himself with an imperial quart measure.

6, and 7. Same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

8. Nil.

9, 10, 11, 12. Same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

13. Conditions regarding the ferry over the Rangitata to stand as per special contract with the Provincial Government; officers of the Supreme Court, magistrates and police constables on duty and prisoners to be ferried free of charge. To afford every assistance in his power in directing strangers to a safe fording across the river.

14, 15, and 16, same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

STRANKS, WILLIAM, River Orari, "Stranks's Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting room.

2. Not less than fourteen beds for travellers, in not less than four separate bed rooms.

3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather tight, and fit for the accommodation of at least five horses.

The remaining conditions, Nos. 4 and following, are the same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

SMITH, DAVID, Waituna Creek, "Smith's Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting room.

2. Not less than ten beds for travellers, in not less than two separate bed rooms.

3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather tight for the accommodation of at least seven horses.

The remaining conditions, No. 4 and following, are the same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

WARD, JOSEPH, Rangitata or Alford River, "Ward's Rangitata Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting room.

2. Not less than ten beds for travellers, in not less than three separate bed-rooms.

3, and 4, same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

5. To keep at all times a proper supply of oats, and oaten or grass hay. Oats to be charged for to travellers at not more than ninepence per imperial quart measure and to provide himself with an imperial quart measure.

6, and 7, same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

8. Nil.

9. Not to keep a lamp burning at night outside the house.

10, 11, 12, same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

13. To provide a horse, and be ready at all reasonable times between the hours of sunrise and sunset to convey passengers across the river Rangitata on horseback, at a charge not exceeding two shillings and sixpence each. To direct drivers of drays and other vehicles, and if required, to accompany them across the river at a charge of two shillings and sixpence each. To erect and maintain a flag pole 40 feet in height, and keep a sufficiently large flag flying thereon daily, from sunrise to sunset. The pole to be erected on the terrace immediately above the house, so as to indicate the fording place to persons from the northward. Officers of the Supreme Court, magistrates and police constables on duty and prisoners to be put across the river free of charge. To afford every assistance in his power in directing strangers to a safe fording across the river.

14, 15, 16. Same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

WILSON, HENRY, River Waitangi, "Wilson's Waitangi Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap-room or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting room.

2. Not less than 8 beds for travellers, in not less than four separate bed-rooms.

3, 4, 5, 6, 7. Same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

8. To keep a lamp burning, with two burners, from sunset to sunrise, giving a sufficiently bright light, and being so lighted as not to be visible from the south bank of the river Waitangi.
- 10, 11, 12. Same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.
13. To keep at all times a safe ferry-boat (punt) in good working order, and ready for conveyance of passengers across the Waitangi at all reasonable times between the hours of sunrise and sunset. The fares for passengers, stock, sheep, drays, horses, &c., to be double the rates charged at Newton and Vincent's Ferry, on the Rakaia, subject to revision at the next licensing meeting. Officers of the Supreme Court, magistrates and police constables on duty and prisoners to be ferried free of charge. To afford every assistance in his power in directing strangers to a safe fording across the river.
- 14, 15, 16. Same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

YOUNG, JOHN ALBERT, Arowenua,  
"Young's Accommodation House."

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the tap room or room answering as such, one private sitting room.
2. Not less than twelve beds for travellers, in not less than five separate bed rooms.
- 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.
13. To keep at all times a safe ferry boat (punt) in good working order, and ready for conveyance of passengers across the Arowenua at all reasonable times between the hours of sunrise and sunset. The fare for passengers to be sixpence each when the rope can be used for working the punt, and one shilling each when the rope cannot be used, and for every horse two shillings. Officers of the Supreme Court, magistrates and police constables on duty and prisoners to be ferried

free of charge; and to keep a printed or fairly written copy of the charges posted in some conspicuous place.

The remaining conditions, Nos. 14 and following, are the same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

Tumuka, Arowenua.

1. The same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.
2. Not less than six beds for travellers, in not less than four separate bed rooms.

The remaining conditions, Nos. 3 and following, are the same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

BUTTERWORTH, WILLIAM, Oparwa  
River.

1. Same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.
2. Not less than six beds for travellers, in not less than four separate bed rooms.

The remaining conditions, No. 3 and following, are the same as in James Sawyer Fitch's licence.

JONES, WILLIAM BENJAMIN, Markiki.

1. Same as James Sawyer Fitch's licence.
2. Not less than six beds for travellers, in not less than four separate bed-rooms.
