HIS Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified that he has made the following Reserves, temporarily, under the 19th clause of the Waste Lands Regulations, viz:—

No. 1640, (in red.)—Five acres and thirty perches, more or less, situate in the Oxford district, bounded on the southward by the Oxford and Rangiora road; on the eastward by Reserve 360 (in red); on the westward by Section 9065; and on the northward by a line parallel to, and one chain distant from, the southern boundary, subject to a road 1 chain wide, crossing the above described

land, part of I. P. Rs. W. R. on Run 223 Cl. 2, are included in the above description. For the Rangiora and Oxford Railway.

No. 1641, (in red.)—Forty acres, more or less, situate in the Waipara district, being a rectangular block of land 1155 links from east to west, and 3465 links from north to south, so as to include the site of the present quarry. The above described land is situate about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of the Waitohi river, and 40 chains east of the Great North Road. For a quarry.

No. 1642, (in red.)—Sections numbered 417, 418, 423, 424, 434, 435, 450, 451, 478, 479, 494, 495, 498, 532, 533, 550,

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- 551, 219, 220, 656, 502, 503, 631, 608, 613, 625, and 626, on the map of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Canterbury, setting out and describing the town of Ashburton. For Provincial Government purposes.
- No. 1643, (in red.)—Sections numbered 511, 592, 593, 593A, 589, 590, 591, 572, 573, and 574, on the map of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Canterbury, setting out and describing the town of Ashburton. For General Government purposes.
- No. 1644, (in red.)—1140 acres, more or less, situate in the Waitangi district, bounded on the south-west by Reserve, No. 642 (in red), on the north-west and south-east, by lines in continuation of the north-west and south-east boundaries of said Reserve, and on the north-east by a line parallel to the south-western boundary, drawn through a point on the centre line of Railway reserve, situate 20 chains south of the 29-mile peg: save and except Reserve No. 639 and portions of Reserves Nos. 377, 631, 953, and 1316, which are included within the above-described boundaries, and for which allowance has been made in acreage. For ferry, railway, and telegraph purposes.
- No. 1645, (in red.)—All that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement two roods, more or less, being sections Nos. 92 and 93, situate in, and fronting on Shearman street, in the town of Waimate. For education purposes.
- No. 1646, (in red.)—Five acres, more or less, situate in the town of Waimate, bounded on the north-westward by Queen-street, on the north-eastward by the south-western bank of the gully situate south-west of Victoria terrace, on the south-east by a line parallel to the north-west boundary, and $11\frac{1}{2}$ chains distant therefrom, and on the south-westward by a line at right angles to the aforesaid street, so as to include the above quantity, save and except Reserve No. 1582 (in red). For purposes of the Provincial Government.
- No. 1647, (in red.)—Ten acres, more or less, situate in the town of Waimate, having 10 chains frontage to the south-eastern side of Queen street, and extending south-easterly 10 chains in a rectangular block; the north-west corner of the above described land is situate at the angle of the street about 17 chains south-west of the westernmost corner of Reserve No. 1582 (in red). For a recreation ground.
- No. 1648, (in red.)—Ten acres, more or less, situate in the town of Waimate, having 10 chains frontage to the south-eastern side of Queen street, and extending south-easterly 10 chains in a rectangular block south-west of and adjoining Reserve 1647 (in red). For a gravel pit.
- No. 1650, (in red.)—All that tract of land three quarters of a mile wide, situate in the Ashburton and Timaru districts, west of and adjoining Reserve No. 381 (in red), extending northerly from the northern bank of the river Orari to a point on the western boundary of the aforesaid Reserve, bearing from trig. station No. 65A, N. 29deg. 30min. E. (mag.), and distant therefrom about 3 miles 25 chains. For a line of railway.
- No. 1651, (in red), Two hundred and twenty-six acres, more or less, situate in the Oxford district, bounded on the north-eastward by the river Eyre, on the north-westward by I.P.R.'s G.H. on Run No. 1, on the south-westward by the Eyre road south, and on the south-eastward by H.P.R. on Run No. 35, and a line in continuation of the north-western boundary thereof. For a recreation ground.
