PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the owners and occupiers of land and householders in the Educational District of Leeston have failed within the time limited for that purpose by the Board of Education to contribute and pay to the Provincial Treasurer the amount fixed by the Board as the contribution of the said district for School purposes :

Now, therefore, I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in pursuance of the powers vested in me, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an uniform rate of one penny halfpenny in the £, to be leviable within the said district, under the provisions of the 42nd section of "The Education Ordinance, 1873," and I do hereby appoint

JAMES CARSTON

as the person to whom the said rate shall be paid.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, intituled "The Education Ordinance, 1873," it is

among other things provided that the Superintendent may, under the provisions of section 26 of the said Ordinance, declare any portion of the Province not comprised within the limits of any Educational District to be an Educational District :

Now, therefore, I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the powers vested in me do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare the portion of the Province hereinafter described to be an Educational District, with the name and with the boundaries as are hereinafter set forth :—

PORT LEVY EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Commencing at the north-east corner of section 780 ; thence along the northern boundary of said section and section 3762 to the north-west corner of the latter section ; thence north-westerly in a straight line to the north-east corner of section 6702 ; thence westerly along the northern boundary of said section to its north-west corner ; thence westerly in a straight line to the north-west corner of Pre-Emptive Right ; thence southerly along Pre-Emptive Right to its south-west corner ; thence southerly in a straight line to the south-west corner of section 21124 ; thence along the southern boundary of said section to its south-east corner ; thence easterly in a straight line to the south-east corner of section 15724 ; thence in a straight line to the ridge

separating Holmes' Gully from Port Levy: following the latter ridge northward to the west, head of Pigeon Bay; thence along the sea to the starting point.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and the Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury intituled "The Canterbury Sheep Ordinance, 1872," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for sheep landed at the Port of Lyttelton to be driven to a distance not exceeding twenty miles from the port before being dressed as provided by the said Ordinance, if they shall be so driven for the purpose of being dressed at some place specially appointed for the purpose by the Superintendent by notice in the Provincial *Government Gazette*:

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby, for the purpose aforesaid, proclaim and appoint the sheep dipping apparatus and enclosure erected by the Provincial Government at the Addington railway station, being a place within twenty miles from the said Port of Lyttelton to be a place to which sheep landed in Lyttelton may be driven to be dressed, in accordance with the terms of the thirty-first clause of the above-recited Ordinance.

It is also further notified that the Chief Inspector of Sheep has been authorised to make the following charges, viz.:

For any number of sheep under twenty, a sum of twenty shillings.

For twenty and up to one thousand, one shilling per head.

Above one thousand, sixpence per head.

HIS Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified that he has made the following Reserves temporarily under the 19th clause of the Waste Lands Regulations, viz:—

No. 1714, in red—Five acres more or less situate in the Ashburton district, taking frontage of five chains to the South road and railway reserve and extending back south-easterly 10 chains in a rectangular block N.E. of and adjoining section 21220. For a gravel pit.

No. 1715, in red—Five acres, more or less, situate in the Ashburton district, taking frontage of five chains to the

- South Road and railway reserve, and extending back south-easterly 10 chains in a rectangular block. The northernmost corner of this reserve is situate nearly opposite the south-most corner of reserve 1423 in red. For a gravel pit.

- No. 1717, in red—Five acres, more or less, situate in the Ashburton district, taking frontage of five chains to the South Road and railway reserve, and extending back south-easterly 10 chains in a rectangular block south-west of and adjoining the road forming the south-west boundary of section 21,049. For a gravel pit.
