PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, intituled "The Education Ordinance, 1873," it is among other things provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent to alter boundaries of any Educational District and to divide any Educational District into two or more districts or parts of districts, or to combine two or more districts or parts of districts into one or to add portions of any district to any adjoining district, or to add any locality not being or forming part of a district to an Educational District, and in every such case the district or districts constituted or affected thereby shall be deemed to be and shall be proclaimed as provided in the said Ordinance as newly constituted Educational District or Districts.

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the 27th section of the said before-recited Ordinance, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council do hereby alter the limits of the Templeton, Riccarton, and Fernside Educational Districts, and I do hereby proclaim the districts as specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed to be newly constituted Educational Districts within the meaning of "The Education Ordinance, 1873."

SCHEDULE.

TEMPLETON EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Commencing at the intersection of the south-western side of the old river

bed by the road north-west of section 1768, following north-easterly along the road to another road on the west side of section 4447, following north-easterly along that road to the south-east corner of section 2438, thence along the southern boundary of Yaldhurst Education District to where Bealey's Road is intersected by Dawson's and Waimakariri Road; thence along Bealey's Road to the road to the south-west side of section 5835, following south-easterly along that road to the north-east boundary of the Broadfield Educational District, and following along that boundary, and the boundary of the Prebleton Educational District to the commencing point.

RICCARTON EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Commencing at the north-east corner of section No. 9; thence by the Town Belt to the river Avon; thence along the river Avon to the south-east corner of section No. 7; thence north-westerly by the north-east and northern boundaries of said section to the river Avon; thence by the river Avon to the south-east corner of section 242; thence north-westerly by the eastern boundary of said section, and south-westerly by the north-west boundaries of said section and section 188 to the northern branch of the river Avon; thence north-westerly along the north-east boundaries of sections Nos. 94, 70, 83, to the north-east corner of the said section; thence

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southerly along the road forming the eastern boundaries of sections 568 and 115 to the south-east corner of the latter; thence north-westerly along the Fendalton road to where it meets Reserve 324; thence southerly along the Kaiapoi Junction Road to the Harewood Road by Riccarton; thence along the said road to the north-east corner of section No. 1155; thence along the eastern boundary of said section to its south-east corner; thence along the southern boundary of said section to the north-east corner of section 1474; thence south-westerly along the eastern boundary of sections 1474, 2068, 2438, 4463, reserve 320, sections 5993, 4465, and 4453, to the south-east corner of the latter section; thence westerly along the south-east boundaries of sections 4030, 4029, and Reserve 331 to the north-east corner of section 1948; thence easterly along the northern boundaries of sections 2776, 2625, 2564, and to a point where the old river bed touches the western boundary of section 952; thence north-easterly along the western boundary of section 952; thence north-easterly along the western boundary of the latter section and section 867 to the north-east corner of the latter section, then north-westerly by the western and northern boundaries of section 1246 to the northern corner of said section; thence easterly in a straight line to the Riccarton Railway Station; thence by the railway to the northern boundary of section 128; thence north-easterly by the north-west boundaries of sections 128, 118, 113, and northern boundary of section 9 to the starting point.

**FERNSIDE EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.**

Bounded on the north by the River Ashley, on the east by the road forming the eastern boundary of sections 1539 and 5910; on the south by the main drain, continuing westerly along the road in continuation of the said main drain to its junction with the Rangiora and Oxford road; thence following the latter road to the road forming the western boundary of section 3811; thence northerly along such road to the River Cust; thence easterly along this river to the road to the east of section 2991; thence northerly along such road to the south-eastern corner of the last named section; thence westerly along the southern boundary of the same section; northerly along its western boundary; westerly along the southern boundary of section 3195, and northerly along the western boundary of the latter section, and of section 3245, and a straight line in continuation thereof due north to the River Ashley.

**PROCLAMATION.**

**W**HEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, intituled "The Education Ordinance, 1873," it is among other things provided that the Superintendent may, under the provisions of section 26 of the said Ordinance, declare any portion of the Province not comprised within the limits of any Educational District to be an Educational District:

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the powers vested in me do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare the portion of the Province hereinafter described to be an Educational District, with the name and with the boundaries as are hereinafter set forth:—

**YALDHURST EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.**

Commencing at the north-west boundary of the Harewood road District, following the boundary of that district to the Kaiapoi and Prebbleton Junction Road; thence along the said road to the Harewood Road by Riccarton; thence along the said road to the north-east corner of section No. 1155; thence along the eastern boundary of said section to its south-east corner; thence along the southern boundary of the said section to north-east corner of section 1474; thence along the eastern boundary of the said section to sections 2068 and 2438 to the south-east corner of the latter section; thence westerly along the southern boundary of the last-named section to its south-west corner; thence southerly along the eastward boundary of section 2565 to the Waimakariri old river bed; thence along the old river bed to Bealey's Road; thence along Bealey's Road to Dawson's and Waimakariri Road; thence along the said road to the West Coast Road; thence due north to the Waimakariri; thence along the said river to the starting point.

George Rhodes, runholder, deceased), James Gibson, of Timaru, in the Province and Colony aforesaid, road contractor, Henry Cain, also of Timaru, manager of the Timaru Landing and Shipping Company (limited), Henry John LeCren, also of Timaru, runholder, and William Wilson, of Christchurch aforesaid, merchant, being respectively seized of all those pieces or parcels of land herein-after more particularly described, that is to say: We the said Robert Heaton Rhodes, and the said Robert Heaton Rhodes and William Donald, as such Trustees as aforesaid, being seized in fee simple of all those pieces or parcels of land being parts of Rural Sections numbered 730 and 1652 on the map of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Canterbury, one hundred links wide, and running through sections numbered respectively 730 and 1652, in a straight line from Arthur Street, and being a continuation of the said street a distance of twelve chains sixty links from Grey Road, and parallel to North Street; and also of and in all those pieces or parcels of land being other parts of sections 730 and 1652, one hundred links wide, being a continuation of Church Street from Rhodes Town, running westerly from Grey Road through said Rural Section numbered 730 and 1652, a distance of twelve chains sixty links; and also of and in all those pieces or parcels of land being other portions of Rural Section 730 and 1652, one hundred links wide, being a continuation of Elizabeth Street, westerly, through sections numbered 730 and 1652, a distance of twelve chains sixty links from Grey Road, and parallel to North Street. I, the said James Gibson, being seized in fee simple of all that piece or parcel of land, being part of Rural Section numbered 1757 on the said map of the Chief Surveyor of the said Province, one hundred links wide, being a continuation of Church Street from Rhodes Town, running westerly from Grey Road through sections 730 and 1652, a distance of three chains ninety links; and also of and in all that piece or parcel of land being another portion of said rural section numbered 1757, one hundred links wide, being a continuation of Elizabeth Street, westerly, through sections 730 and 1652, a distance of three chains ninety links from Grey Road, and parallel to North Street. I, the said Henry Cain, being seized in fee simple of all that piece or parcel of land being part of Rural Section numbered 1766 on the said map of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Canterbury, one hundred links wide, being a continuation of Church Street, from Rhodes Town to Sandie Town, running westerly from Grey Road through sections 730, 1652, and 1757, a distance of six chains two links; and also of and in all that piece or parcel of land being another part of said section 1766, one hundred links wide, being a continuation of Elizabeth Street, westerly, through the said sections 730, 1652, and 1757, a distance of six chains two links; and also of and in all that piece or parcel of land, fifty links wide from off the western boundary and known as Le Cren Street, being another part of said Rural Section 1766, commencing at a point

on the northern side of North Street, the said point being twenty-two chains fifty-two links west of Grey Road, and running northerly at right angles to North Street a distance of fifty-two chains sixty-two links to a road south of Cemetery Reserve, number 146, in red; we the said Henry John Le Cren and William Wilson being seized in fee simple of and in all that piece or parcel of land fifty links wide from the eastern boundary of section 1959, and known as Le Cren Street aforesaid, and being part of said section numbered 1959, commencing at a point on the northern side of North Street, the said point being twenty-three chains two links west of Grey Road, and running northerly at right angles to North Street a distance of fifty-two chains sixty-two links to the said road, south of Cemetery Reserve, number 146, in red; and also of and in all that piece or parcel of land fifty links wide, and being another part of Rural Section numbered 1959, known as Hunt Street, commencing at a point on the western side of Le Cren Street, a distance of eleven chains fifteen links north of North Street, running westerly through said section, numbered 1959 to Wilson Street, a distance of nine chains, and parallel to North Street. And also of and in all that piece or parcel of land being another part of Rural Section numbered 1959, fifty links wide, commencing at a point on the western side of Le Cren Street, a distance of twenty-two chains eighty links north of North Street, and running westerly parallel to North Street to Wilson Street, and known as Commercial Street. And also of and in all that piece or parcel of land being another portion of said section, numbered 1959, fifty links wide, commencing at a point on the western side of Le Cren Street, a distance of thirty-four chains forty-five links north of North Street, and running westerly parallel to North Street, and known as Meremere Street; and also of and in all that piece or parcel of land being another portion of said section, numbered 1959, fifty links wide, commencing at a point on the western side of Le Cren Street about forty-two chains ninety-five links north of North Street, and running westerly across said section to Wilson Street, which it meets at a point forty-two chains sixty-three links distant from North Street. As the said roads or streets are more particularly delineated in the plan drawn hereon, and therein respectively named and coloured brown, for valuable consideration, we do, and each of us doth hereby respectively dedicate the said land to the public, to the intent that the same may for ever hereafter be used as, and be, public highways to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
