PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the owners and occupiers of land and householders in the Educational District of Saltwater Creek have failed, within the time limited for that purpose by the Board of Education, to contribute and pay to the Provincial Treasurer the amount fixed by the Board as the contribution of the said district for school purposes:

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in pursuance of the powers vested in me, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an uniform rate of fourpence half-penny in the £ to be leviable within the said district under the provisions of the 42nd section of "The Education Ordinance, 1873," and I do hereby appoint

as the person to whom the said rate shall be paid.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, intituled "The Education Ordinance, 1873," it is among other things provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent to alter

boundaries of any Educational District and to divide any Educational District into two or more districts or parts of districts, or to combine two or more districts or parts of districts into one or to add portions of any district to any adjoining district, or to add any locality not being or forming part of a district to an Educational District, and in every such case the district or districts constituted or affected thereby shall be deemed to be and shall be proclaimed as provided in the said Ordinance as newly constituted Educational District or Districts:

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the 27th section of the said before-recited Ordinance, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council do hereby alter the limits of the Lincoln and Greenpark Educational Districts, and I do hereby proclaim the districts as specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed to be newly-constituted Educational Districts within the meaning of "The Education Ordinance, 1873."

SCHEDULE.

LINCOLN EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Commencing at a point on Shand's Road, the same being the north-western corner of section 3655; thence by the south-western boundaries of that section and sections 3678, 3665, 3200, 3187, 3203, 3209, 3210, 3676, 3184, to the north-western corner of Reserve 216; thence by the south-western boundaries of that reserve and sections 4031, 4946, 3257, 3189,

and 2725, to the south-eastern corner of section 2725; thence southerly by the Springs Road to the south-western corner of section 2937; thence easterly by the southern boundaries of sections 2937 and 6306 to the north-western corner of 7644; thence northerly along the lagoon to the north-west corner of section 9515; thence easterly along the northern boundary of said section to its north-east corner; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of section 9525, and easterly along the southern boundaries of sections 10211, 9449, and southerly along the western boundary of section 4727 to the River Halswell; thence north-easterly by the River Halswell and the creek forming the eastern boundary of section 1882 to the north-east corner of section 2968; thence in a straight line to the north-eastern corner of section 2490; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that section to its northern corner; thence northerly by the western boundary of section 2491 to its northern corner; thence by the northern boundaries of sections 2839, 2821, and following Lanbrook's Road to the north-east corner of reserve 200; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of that reserve to its southern corner; thence westerly by the north-eastern boundary of section 2955 to its northern corner; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of sections 3126, 3644, 2904, to the southern corner of that section; thence by the southern boundary of that section to the starting point.

GREENPARK EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Starting at the junction of L1 Creek with Lake Ellesmere; thence northerly and north-easterly up the said creek to the north-west corner of section 7644; thence northerly up the creek and lagoon to the north-west corner of section 9515; thence easterly along the northern boundary of said section to its north-east corner; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of section 9525, and easterly along the southern boundaries of sections 10211, 9449, and southerly along the west boundary of section 4727 to the River Halswell; thence southerly along the River Halswell to the road to the south of section 4870; thence easterly along this road to its junction with the Reserve for road and drain purposes (the said reserve being to the east of section 11432) thence southerly along the said reserve to Lake Ellesmere, and westerly along the shore of the Lake to the starting point.

PROCLAMATION.
