PROCLAMATION.

By THOMAS HENRY FITZGERALD,
 Superintendent of the Province of
 Hawke's Bay, in the Islands of
 New Zealand.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Provincial Reserved Bills Act, 1858," it is provided that no Bill reserved for the signification of the Governor's pleasure shall have any force within the Province, until the Superintendent shall signify as therein specified that it has been laid before the Governor, and that his Excellency has assented to the same: And whereas an Act intituled an "Appropriation Act," was passed by

the Provincial Council of Hawke's Bay during the late session, but reserved by me for the signification of the Governor's pleasure,—

Now therefore, I, THOMAS HENRY FITZGERALD, Do Hereby Proclaim and Notify that the above-mentioned Act has been duly laid before his Excellency the Governor, and having received his assent, is, under the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly before referred to, in force within the Province of Hawke's Bay from the date of this Proclamation.
