PROCLAMATION.

By DONALD M'LEAN Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Hawke's Bay, in the Colony of New Zealand.

I DONALD M'LEAN, Superintendent, as aforesaid, by virtue of all powers in this behalf in anywise enabling me as Deputy for His Excellency Sir George Grey, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby call out for the purpose of training—

1. All the men of the 1st and 2nd classes of the Napier Regiment of Militia, known as companies Nos. 1 and 2, Napier Town.
2. All the men known as the Napier Volunteers—Capt. Buchanan's company.
3. All the men of the 1st and 2nd classes of the Napier Regiment of Militia, known as company No. 4, Napier Country district.
4. All the men of the 1st and 2nd class of the Napier Regiment of Militia, known as company No. 3, Clive.

And I hereby authorise and request Lieut. Colonel George Stoddart Whitmore, the Officer commanding Militia and Volunteers in Hawke's Bay, to carry into effect this direction
