IN THE SUPREME COURT OF NEW ZEALAND.

MIDDLE DISTRICT.

In the matter of the Petition of JOHN RIGBY, of Wairoa, in the Province of Hawke's Bay, settler, and in the matter of the Debtors and Creditors Act, 1862; and in the matter of the Debtors and Creditors Act Amendment Act, 1865; and in the matter of the Debtors and Creditors Act Amendment Act, 1866.

On the thirteenth day of February, 1867.

ON reading the petition of John Rigby and on hearing Mr Lee of counsel for the said John Rigby it is ordered that the estate and effects of the petitioner be sequestered in the hands of the Inspector in Bankruptcy for the Province of Hawke's Bay; and that the said petitioner do come up for hearing before His Honor Mr Justice Johnston at the Supreme Court House Napier on the first practicable sittings of the said Court at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon and that a meeting of the Creditors of the said petitioner be held at a time and place to

fixed by the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Hawke's Bay for the purpose of recommending Trustees of the said Estate and the mode of winding up the said Estate and to report to this Honorable Court whether the Creditors recommend that the said Debtor should obtain his final discharge without reference to the amount of his Estate. And it is further ordered that until the hearing of the said petition the said petitioner be protected from arrest except in such cases as would render him liable to arrest or mesne process by the order of a Judge of this Court or of a Registrar of this Court in the absence of a Judge thereof. And it is further ordered that all creditors of the said petitioner do have liberty to apply to this Honorable Court to rescind this order as they may be advised.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor DONALD M'LEAN, Esq.,
Superintendent of the Province of
Hawke's Bay, in the Islands of New
Zealand.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General
Assembly of New Zealand, Session
4, No. 16, intituled "The Superintendent's
Deputy Act, of-1856," the Superintendent
of any Province is empowered by Procla-
mation in the Provincial Government Ga-
zette to appoint such registered Elector of
the Province as he may think fit to be his
Deputy, and as such to perform and exer-
cise all the acts and powers (except such
powers as are conferred by the Constitution
Act) which may be exercised and performed
by such Superintendent, or such of them
as shall be specified in such Proclamation.

Now, therefore, I, Donald M'Lean,
Superintendent of the Province of Hawke's
Bay, do hereby, in virtue of the power
conferred on me by the aforesaid Act, pro-
claim that I have this day appointed

JOSEPH RHODES, Esq., J.P.

to be Deputy-Superintendent of this Pro-
vince under the provisions of the above-
recited Act.
