As it is desirable not to interfere more than can be avoided with the time of settlers, during shearing and harvest, each man will be expected to parade 5 times, and after that drilling, unless disturbances occur, will be suspended for a time.

Officers are requested to ascertain as far as possible where the arms belonging to men of their districts who have gone away are to be found, and to issue them to the unarmed men of their companies.

When all arms that can be found are collected, officers are requested to send lists of the armed men and numbers of the arms in their possession, and also requisitions for the number of arms required to complete their men.

PROCLAMATION.

By JOSEPH RHODES, Esq., Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Hawke's Bay, in the Islands of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Provincial Council of Hawke's Bay, Session 12, No. 1, it is amongst other things enacted that the Superintendent may from time to time, by proclamation, appoint public Pounds and Poundkeepers at such places as he may think fit, and at any time to annul such appointments and make others.

Now, therefore, I, JOSEPH RHODES, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Hawke's Bay, do hereby annul the appointment of JOHN SIM as Poundkeeper of the public Pound at Mohaka, and do hereby appoint EDWIN HUDSON Poundkeeper of the said public Pound, situate at Mohaka.
