

every such delegation may from time to time alter or revoke, and also that any such delegation may be so made to any person holding office in or under the General Government of New Zealand, or in or under any Provincial Government thereof, by the title of his office, and may be therein expressed to be made to such officer and his successors in such office; and when so expressed to be made, the powers and authorities thereby delegated shall from time to time, until revocation thereof, be held and exercised only by the person for the time being holding such office, and no other person.

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, do by this Order delegate unto

- The Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, and his successors in such office,
- The Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, and his successors in such office,
- The Superintendent of the Province of Hawke's Bay, and his successors in such office,
- The Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, and his successors in such office,
- The Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, and his successors in such office,
- The Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, and his successors in such office,
- The Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, and his successors in such office,
- The Superintendent of the Province of Otago, and his successors in such office,
- The Superintendent of the Province of Southland, and his successors in such office,

such of the powers vested in me as Governor by Section 7 of the said Act, as enable me to erect, superintend, and maintain harbour marks, buoys, lights, and beacons, within the limits of any port or the approaches thereto, in the Province of which for the time being he or any such successor shall be Superintendent, subject however to such directions as may from time to time be issued by the Colonial Marine Engineer, as to the size, position, and colour of such harbour marks, buoys, lights, and beacons; and do also delegate to the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland, and his successors in such office; the Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, and his successors in such office; the Superintendent of the Province of Hawke's Bay, and his successors in such office; the Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, and his successors in such office; the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, and his successors in such office; the Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, and his successors in such office; the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, and his successors in such office; the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, and his successors in such office; the Superintendent of the Province of Southland, and his succes-

sors in such office, within the Province of which for the time being he is or any of his successors shall be Superintendent, the powers vested in me by Sections 12, 13, 17, and 42 of the said Act, to have and exercise the said powers hereby delegated so long only as each Superintendent, or any such successor in office shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer.

STAMP DUTIES.—NOTICE.—There being reason to suppose that persons are in the habit of giving and accepting unstamped receipts as acquittances for moneys paid by cheque, under the belief that the stamp borne by the cheque exonerates the receipt from liability to stamp duty,—the public are cautioned against the adoption of this practice.

Such receipts are inadmissible as evidence of the payment of money until properly stamped, and every person signing or causing the signature of such receipt is liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for each offence.

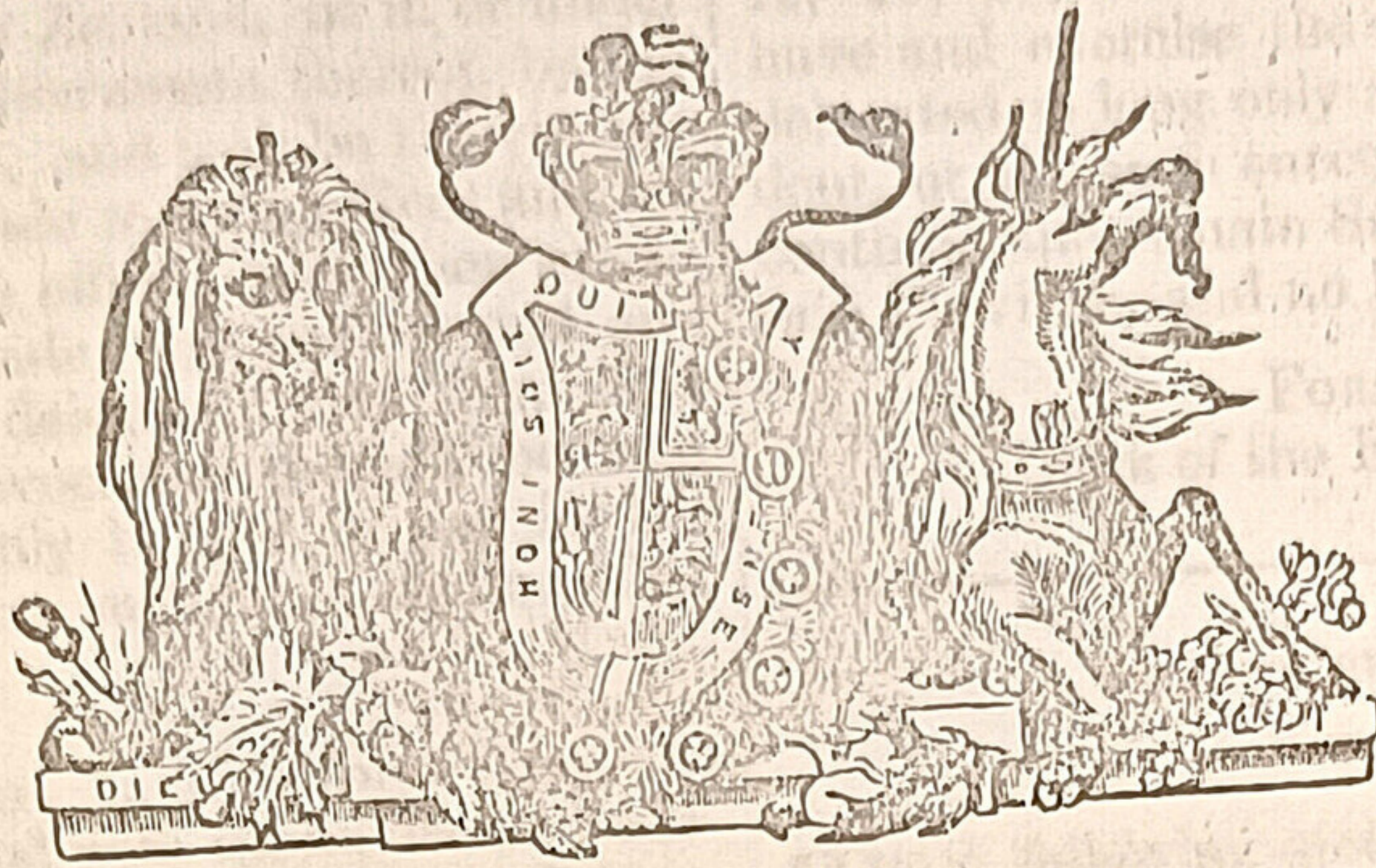

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Provincial Reserved Bill Act, 1858," it is provided that no Bill reserved for the signification of the Governor's pleasure shall have any force within the Province until the Superintendent shall signify as therein specified, that it has been laid before the Governor, and that His Excellency has assented to the same: And whereas certain Acts intituled

"The Appropriation Act," Session 12, No. 6,
"Credit Act," Session 12, No. 8,

were passed by the Provincial Council of Hawke's Bay during last session, but reserved by me for the signification of the Governor's pleasure,

Now, therefore, I, Donald McLean, Superintendent of the Province of Hawke's Bay, do hereby proclaim and notify that the abovementioned Acts have been duly laid before His Excellency the Governor, and, having received his assent, are, under the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly before referred to, in force within the Province of Hawke's Bay from the date of this proclamation.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the eighth day of January, 1868.

THE PRESIDENT AND MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.
