PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor JOHN DAVIES ORMOND, Superintendent of the Province of Hawke's Bay, in the Islands of New Zealand.

WHEREAS under the provision of the "Highways Act, 1871," passed by the Provincial Council of Hawke's Bay, it is provided that the Superintendent may, for the purposes of the Act, from time to time, by proclamation, divide the province, or any part thereof, into districts, and in like manner to alter and amend the names or boundaries of, or abolish any such districts, and to create new districts. And whereas it is expedient to alter and amend the districts known as

Turiroa, proclaimed March 7, 1871; Te Mata, proclaimed May 2, 1871; Waimarama, proclaimed May 2, 1871; Kaikora West, proclaimed April 15, 1872; Kauranaki, proclaimed April 15, 1872; Oero, proclaimed April 15, 1872; Patangata, proclaimed April 15, 1872; Mohaka, proclaimed April 15, 1872; Peka Peka and Patoka, proclaimed April 15, 1872; Seventy-Mile Bush, proclaimed April 15, 1872; Tamumu and Pourerere, proclaimed April 15, 1872; Turiroa, proclaimed April 15, 1872; Tutaekuri and Okawa, proclaimed April 15, 1872; Wainui and South Porangahau, proclaimed April 15, 1872; Waipawa East, proclaimed April 15, 1872; Raukawa, proclaimed February 5, 1873; Waipawa West, proclaimed February 5, 1873; North Ruataniwha, proclaimed February 5, 1873; Kereru and Aorangi, proclaimed July 5,

1873; Waipukurau, proclaimed October 29, 1874; Central Ruataniwha, proclaimed October 29, 1874.

And to create other districts in lieu thereof, and also to create new districts. Now, therefore I, JOHN DAVIES ORMOND, Superintendent of the Province of Hawke's Bay, in virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Proclamations dated respectively March 7, 1871; May 2, 1871; April 15, 1872; February 5, 1873; July 5, 1873; and October 29, 1874; shall, so far as regards the districts therein created, which are named respectively

Turiroa, Te Mata, Waimarama, Kaikora West, Kauranaki, Oero, Patangata, Mohaka, Peka Peka and Patoka, Seventy-Mile Bush, Tamumu and Pourerere, Turiroa, Tutaekuri and Okawa, Wainui and South Porangahau, Waipawa East, Raukawa, Waipawa West, North Ruataniwha, Kereru and Aorangi, Waipukurau, Central Ruataniwha.

—Be rescinded as from the date hereof.

And I do further declare and proclaim that every of the several areas of land described in the Schedule to this Proclamation and the boundaries thereof, as severally laid down in such Schedule, shall form a separate Highways District under the respective names of

Porangahau, Eparaima, Tamumu, Oero, Te Mata, Waipukurau, Makaretu, Ruataniwha, Waipaoa, Patangata, North Ruataniwha, Kereru and Aorangi, Kaki-raawa, Raukawa, Maraekakahu, Okawa,

Petane, Mohaka, Wairoa, Wairoa Country, Nuhaka, Norsewood, Norsewood deferred payments, Danevirk, Woodville, Woodville deferred payments.

—Within the terms and meaning of the said "Highways Act, 1871."

SCHEDULE.

Porangahau District.

Starts at the sea coast, at the north of the Waimata Stream at the Southern boundary of the Province; runs along the southern boundary of the Province, to Wahatuara; thence along the western boundary of the Tautane Block to its north-western extremity, thence in a straight line bearing north-north-east to the source of the Tangaruhe Creek; down that creek to the Mangaorapa Stream; thence down that stream to the Porangahau River, and up that river to the south-east boundary of Porangahau suburban section No. 80, along the south-eastern boundary of that section to its easternmost corner, thence along the north-eastern boundary of sections Nos. 79 and 78, to the south-western corner of block No. 76. Porangahau District, along the western and northern boundaries of that block to the western boundary of Porangahau suburban section No. 61, along the western boundary of that section and of section No. 65, to the north-western corner of the last named section, thence along the northern boundary of sections Nos. 65, 64, 63, 62, 8, and 25, to the Porangahau River. Crossing that river and following down its east bank to its mouth; and thence along the sea coast in a southerly direction to the starting point at the mouth of the Waimataa Stream.

Eparaima District.

Starts at the sea coast at the northern boundary of the Porangahau District, follows along that boundary to the source of the Tangaruhe Creek; thence in a line bearing north-west to the southern-most corner of block No. 77. Porangahau District on the Mangapuaka Creek; down that creek to the Wangai Stream, up that stream and along the western boundary of block No. 56, to the Taurakaitai Stream, thence down that stream to the western boundary of block No. 37 along that boundary to the Purimu Stream and up that stream to the western boundary of block No. 7, along that boundary to the Ngahape Stream; thence down that stream to the Hapuku line and along that line

to the sea coast at Blackhead; and thence along the sea coast in a southerly direction to the starting point at the junction with the Porangahau District.

Tamumu District.

Starts at the sea coast at Blackhead, at the junction with the Eparaima District, runs along the northern boundary of that district to the Tangituporo Stream and down that stream to the Tuki Tuki River and down that river to the mouth of the Mangarara Stream, and up that stream to the north-west boundary of block No. 30, Mangakuri District; thence along the north-west boundary of that block to its north-west corner; thence along the eastern boundary of block No. 46 Tarawera District to the Omakare Stream; thence up that stream to the northern boundary of block No. 10. Pourerere District thence along the northern boundary of that block, and of block No. 5, to the sea coast at Paoanui, and along the sea coast in a southerly direction to the starting point at Blackhead.

Oero District.

Starts at the sea coast at Paoanui, at the northern boundary of the Tamumu District, follows along the northern and eastern boundaries of that district to the Tuki Tuki River, down that river to the mouth of the Hawea Stream, and up that stream to the northern boundary of block No. 63. Oero District, thence along that boundary and the northern and eastern boundaries of block No. 68, to the northern boundary of the Te Apiti native block along that boundary to the sea coast, and along the sea coast in a southerly direction to the starting point at Paoanui.

Te Mata District.

Starts at the sea coast at the northern boundary of the Oero District, follows along the northern boundary of that district to the north-east corner of Block No. 68, Oero district; thence along the western boundary of the Waimarama native block to the Ngamangatawa Stream; down that stream and the Maraetotara Stream to the southern boundary of block No. 12, Kidnapper District; along that boundary to the Mangangarara Stream; down that stream to the Tuki Tuki River; thence down that river to a point bearing due east (magnetic) from the easternmost corner of the Havelock District (Te Mata, Trig Station); from that point running due west to the said Trig Station; and from thence along the south-eastern and north-eastern boundaries of the Havelock District to the Ngaruroro River; and down that river to the south-east boundary of the Clive and Hikutoto

District; thence along that boundary to the sea coast, and along the sea coast in an easterly and southerly direction to the starting point at the northern boundary of the Oero District.

Waipukurau District.

Starts at the junction of the Tangituporo Stream with the Tuki Tuki River, follows up the Tangituporo Stream to the northern boundary of the Eparaima District; thence along the northern and western boundaries of that district to the Tutaekuri Stream; up that stream and the Whatauna Stream to the southern boundary of Block No. 83, Porangahau District; thence along the southern boundary of that block to the Mangapurakau Stream; following down that stream and the Waikopiro Stream, to the western boundary of block No. 69, Porangahau District; following along that boundary to the southern boundary of block No. 120, Ruataniwha District; along the southern and western boundaries of that block, and the southern and western boundaries of block No. 234, to the Makaretu River; thence up that river to the eastern boundary of the Makaretu Reserve, and along the eastern boundary of that reserve to the Tukipo River; thence down that river to the Tuki Tuki River, and down that river to the main south road; thence along that road in a northerly direction to the Waipawa River; down that river to its junction with the Tuki Tuki River; and down that river to the starting point at the junction with the Tangituporo Stream.

Makaretu District.

Starts at the Makaretu River, at the western boundary of the Waipukurau District; follows along the eastern and northern boundaries of the Makaretu Reserve to the Waipawa River, and up that river to the western boundary of the Province; along that boundary to the source of the Makaretu Reserve, and down that river to the starting point at the junction with the Waipukurau District.

Ruataniwha District.

Starts at the Waipawa River, at the junction with the Waipukurau District; follows up the Waipawa River to the eastern boundary of the Makaretu District; thence southerly along that boundary to the Tukipo River, and along the northern boundary of the Waipukurau District to the main south road; and from thence northerly along that road to the starting point on the Waipawa River.

Waipawa District.

Starts at the Waipawa River at the eastern boundary of block No. 46, Patangata District; follows along the eastern boundary of blocks Nos. 46 and 47, and the northern boundary of block No. 47, to the eastern side of the Te Aute road; along the eastern side of that road to the south boundary of block No. 49; along

the south boundary of blocks Nos. 49, 23, 18, and 179, to the south-west corner of block No. 179; thence along the west boundary of that block and of block No. 144, to the north-east corner of block No. 134; thence along the north boundary of that block to the Mangaonuku River; down that river to its junction with the Waipawa River; and thence down that river to the starting point at the eastern boundary of block No. 46.

Patangata District

Starts at the Waipawa River at the south-east corner of the Waipawa District; follows along the eastern boundary of that district to the Kaikoura Creek; thence along the eastern side of the main south road to the road from Patangata to Te Aute; thence along the northern side of that road to the Papanui Stream; thence down that stream to the Tuki Tuki River; thence up that river to its junction with the Waipawa River; and up that river to the starting point at the junction with the Waipawa District.

North Ruataniwha District.

Starts at the junction of the Mangaonuku and Waipawa Rivers; follows up the Mangaonuku River to the northern boundary of the Waipawa District; follows along that boundary to the western boundary of the Patangata District; thence northerly along that boundary to the northern boundary of the College land; thence westerly along that boundary and the northern boundaries of blocks Nos. 13, 142, 12, 141, 11, 140, Ruataniwha District, to the north-western corner of block No. 140; thence in a straight line to the Mangaonuku River, at the westernmost corner of block No. 24, Maraekakahu District; follows up the Mangaonuku River to its source, and along the northern and north-western boundary of block No. 1, Gwavas District, and the western boundary of blocks Nos. 1 and 5, to the Mangamauku River; up that river to its source, and in a straight line to the junction of the Makaroro River, with the north branch of the Waipawa stream; thence down that branch to its junction with the south branch; and thence down the Waipawa River to the starting point at the junction with the Mangaonuku River.

Kereru and Aorangī District.

Starts at the junction of the Mangataihā stream with the Ngaruroro River; thence in a straight line to the junction of the Ettrick stream with the Maraekakaho river; up that river to the south-western corner of Block No. 1, Maraekakaho; thence in a straight line to the north-western corner of Block No. 140, Ruataniwha District; thence along the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of the North Ruataniwha District to the northern boundary of the Makaretu District; along that boundary to the western boundary of the Province; thence along that boundary to the source of the Ngaru-

roro river, and down that river to the starting point at the junction with the Mangatahi stream.

Kakiraawa District.

Starts at Te Mata Trig Station at the western boundary of the Te Mata District; follows along the western boundary of the Te Mata District to the northern boundary of the Oero District; along that boundary and the northern boundary of the Patangata District to Roto-a-kiwa; thence along the western boundary of Pukekura West native block to the bridge track from Poukawa to Ngawhakatara; thence by a line bearing north to the railway line, and along the eastern side of the railway line to the south-western boundary of the Pukahu District; thence along the south-western and south-eastern boundaries of that District, the south-western and south-eastern boundaries of the Havelock District, to the starting point at Te Mata Trig Station, at the western boundary of the Te Mata District.

Raukawa District.

Starts at the eastern side of the railway line, at the southernmost boundary of the Pukahu District; runs along the western boundary of the Kakiraawa District to the northern boundary of the North Ruataniwha District; thence along that boundary to the eastern boundary of the Kereru and Aorangi District; along that boundary to the south-western corner of block No. 1, Maraekakaho District; along the south-eastern and eastern boundaries of that block to the south-western corner of Ngatarawa, No. 3, native block; thence along the southern boundary of that block and of Ngatarawa, No. 5; the south-eastern boundaries of Ngatarawa, Nos. 5 and 4; the north-eastern boundary of Ngatarawa, No. 4; and the eastern boundary of Ngatarawa, No. 1, to the Ngaruroro River; and down that river to its junction with the Awanui Stream; up that stream and along the north-western and south-western boundaries of the Pukahu District, to the starting point at the junction with the Kakiraawa District.

Maraekakaho District

Starts at the Ngaruroro River at the western boundary of the Raukawa District; follows along the western and north-western boundaries of that district to the eastern boundary of the North Ruataniwha District; thence along that boundary and the eastern boundary of the Kereru and Aorangi District to the Ngaruroro River, and up that river to the western boundary of the province; thence along that boundary to the source of the Tutaeakuri River; thence in a straight line to the north-western corner of the Matapiro native block; and along the northern boundary of that block to the junction of the Ngaruroro River, with the Waitio Stream; thence down the Ngaruroro

River to the starting point at the junction with the Raukawa District.

Okawa District

Starts at the western boundary of the Province, at the junction with the north-eastern boundary of the Maraekakaho District; follows along that boundary and the northern boundary of that district, and of the Heretaunga District to the western boundary of the Papakura District; thence along that boundary to the Tutaeakuri River; thence up that river to the western boundary of the Puketapu District; thence along the western and north-western boundaries of that district to the southern boundary of block No. 90, Puketapu District, and along the southern boundaries of blocks Nos. 90 and 72, to the Mangaone River; up that river to its source, and thence in a line bearing due west to the western boundary of the province; and thence southerly along that boundary to the starting point at the junction with the Maraekakaho District.

Petane District

Starts at the western shore of Napier Harbor, at the northern boundary of the Puketapu District; follows along that boundary and the northern boundary of the Okawa District to the western boundary of the province; along that boundary to the northern boundary of the province; thence running easterly along the northern boundary of the province to the Taupo road; thence along the Taupo Road to the Esk River, and along the northern boundary of the Petane native block to the sea coast; following southerly along the sea coast to entrance of Napier Harbor; thence along the western side of the said entrance, and along the southern side of Meanee quay to the south-western corner of the Survey Reserve; from thence in a straight line to the western shore of Napier Harbor, at the south-west boundary of suburban section No. 30, western side of the harbor; and thence following along the western shore of Napier Harbor to the starting point at the northern boundary of the Puketapu District.

Mohaka

Starts at the sea coast, at the northern boundary of the Petane District; follows along that boundary to the Mohaka River; down that river to the sea coast; and thence following southerly along the sea coast to the starting point at the northern boundary of the Petane District.

Wairoa District

Starts at the Wairoa River, at the eastern boundary of the Te Koutu native block; follows along that boundary, the eastern and southern boundaries of the Poutaka native block, and the southern boundary of the Orero native block to the north-eastern boundary of Clyde, rural section No. 1; following along that boundary and the south-western boundary of Clyde suburban sections, class No. 3, Nos.

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49, 50, 61, and 60, and the southern boundary of section No. 59, to the western boundary of section No. 41; along that boundary and the western and southern boundaries of section No. 42 to M'Lean Street; thence southerly and easterly along that street to the Tawhara Stream; down that stream to the Wairoa River, and thence following up that river to the starting point at the eastern boundary of the Te Koutu native block.

Wairoa Country District

Starts at the sea coast, at the mouth of the Mohaka River; follows up the Mohaka River to the Taupo Road; along the Taupo Road to the northern boundary of the province; thence easterly, following along that boundary to the north-eastern boundary of the Tukemokihī native block, No. 1; along the north-eastern, south-eastern and eastern boundaries of that block, and the eastern boundary of the Whakakii native block to the sea coast; and thence along the sea coast to the mouth of the Wairoa River; up that river to the eastern boundary of the Te Koutu native block, at the junction with the Wairoa Town District; thence along the western, northern, and south-western boundaries of that district to the Wairoa River; down that river to its mouth, and thence along the sea coast in a southerly direction to the starting point at the mouth of the Mohaka River.

Nuhaka District

Starts at the sea coast at the eastern boundary of the Wairoa Country District; follows along that boundary to the northern boundary of the province; thence easterly along that boundary to the sea coast; and from thence following along the sea coast southerly and westerly to the starting point at the eastern boundary of the Wairoa Country District.

Norsewood District

Starts at the south-western corner of the Eparaima District, at the junction of the Wangai and Mangapuaka Streams, follows down the Mangapuaka Stream to the Manawatu River, up that river to its junction with the Mangatawainui River, and up that river to a point due east from the south-east corner of rural section No. 1, Whakaruatapu; from that point running in a straight line due west to the said corner of section No. 1; thence along the southern boundary of sections Nos. 1 and 2, to the Whakaruatapu Stream thence running in a straight line due west to the western boundary of the Province; following along that boundary to the southern boundary of the Makaretu District, along that boundary to the western boundary of the Waipukurau District, along the western and southern boundaries of that district to the western boundary of the Eparaima District, and thence along that boundary to the starting point at the junction of the

Wangai and Mangapuaka Streams. Excluding the Norsewood deferred payment District.

Norsewood Deferred Payment District

Starts at the junction of the Manawatu River with the Makotoku Stream, follows up the Makotoku Stream to the south-west boundary of Norsewood settlement, section No. 151, along the south-west boundary of sections Nos. 151, 152, 153, 154, 155, 156, 157, 158, 159, 160, 161, 162, and 163, and south-eastern boundary of sections Nos. 163, and 164 to the Mangarangiara Stream, down that stream to the railway line. Along the railway line in an easterly and north-easterly direction to the Manawatu River and up that river to the starting point at the junction with the Makotoku River.

Danevirke District

Starts at Oporae at the western boundary the Porangahau District, follows along the south-western and western boundaries of the Mangaatoro Native Block and the southern boundary of the Kaitoki Native Block to the Otepe Stream, up that stream to the south-eastern boundary of the Otawhao native block, along that boundary to the Otawhao Stream, and down that stream to the southern boundary of the Otawhao native block; thence along that boundary to the Manawatu River; down that river to the southern boundary of the Oringiwaiaaruhe native block; thence along the southern, western and south-western boundaries of that block to the south-eastern corner of the Maharahara block, along the southern boundary of that block to its south-eastern corner; thence by a straight line running due west to the western boundary of the Province; following along that boundary to the southern boundary of the Norsewood District, along that boundary to the western boundary of the Eparaima District; thence along the south-western boundary of that district and the north-western boundary of the Porangahau District to the starting point at Oporae.

Woodville District

Starts at the southern boundary of the Province, at the western boundary of the Porangahau district; follows along the western boundary of the Porangahau District to the southern boundary of the Danevirke District, along that boundary to the western boundary of the Province, thence southerly along that boundary to the Manawatu River; up that river and along the southern boundary of the Province to the starting point at the western boundary of the Porangahau District. Excluding the Woodville deferred payment District.

Woodville Deferred Payment District.

Starts at the northernmost corner of Woodville, rural section No. 23; follows along the north-western boundary of sections Nos. 23, 22, 21, 20, 19, 18, 17,

16, and 15; the northern boundary of sections Nos. 14, 13, 12, 11, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, and 3, and the northern boundary of Woodville suburban sections Nos. 17, 18, 23, and 24 to the north-western corner of rural section No. 3; along the western boundary of that section to the northern boundary of section No. 2; along the northern boundary of sections No. 2 and 1 and the western boundary of section No. 1 to the road from Napier to the Manawatu Gorge; along that road westerly to a point distant about 23 chains in a straight line from the south-western corner of section No. 1; thence following a line bearing due north (magnetic) a distance of 13550 links; thence in a line bearing 55deg., a distance of 12500 links; and thence in a line bearing 300deg., a distance of 17400 links to the starting point at the northernmost corner of Woodville rural section No. 23.

SCHEDULE.

Clive and Hikutoto District.

Starting from the mouth of the Ngaruroro River; following up that river to the ford at the Karamu pah; thence following along the west side of the road leading into the Te Aute road; to its junction with that road; thence following south-easterly along the Te Aute road to its junction with the Clive road; thence down the Clive road to the northern boundary of the Mangateretere block; thence down the northern boundary line of that block to the north-east corner of same block; thence to the southern corner of Clive suburban section 133, by a straight line; thence by the road bounding the same section towards the south-east across the lagoon to the sea beach; thence by the sea beach to the starting point at the mouth of the Ngaruroro River.

Heretaunga District.

Starting from Pakowhai pah on the old bed of the Ngaruroro River; thence following up the old bed of the Ngaruroro River to the ford at the Karamu pah; thence following along the west side of the road leading into the Te Aute road to its junction with that road; thence following south-easterly along the Te Aute road to the eastern boundary of the Mangateretere block west; thence following along that boundary to the old bed of the Ngaruroro River, and along the old bed of the Ngaruroro River to where the Ngaruroro runs into the Waitio Creek; thence down that creek to the Tutaekuri-waimate Stream; thence down the Tutaekuri-waimate to the starting point at Pakowhai pah.

Meanee District.

Starting from the mouth of the Tutaekuri river, in the Ahuriri lagoon, up that river to the western boundary of Block 1, Puketapu district; thence following the western boundary line of that block to the north-west corner thereof; thence following the boundary line between the Meanee suburban sections and the Puketapu district to the Ahuriri lagoon; thence following the edge of the Ahuriri lagoon to the starting point at the mouth of the Tutaekuri river.

Puketapu District.

Starting from the Junction of the Pakiaka creek with the Tutaekuri river; up the Tutaekuri river to the fence known as Nonus Smith's near the junction of the Mangaene river with the Tutaekuri river; thence along that fence to its termination; thence following a straight line to the westernmost corner of Block 75; thence northerly along the fence between Messrs. Burnet and Whitmore to the northern boundary of Block 65; thence following that boundary to the north-western boundary of Block 75; thence following the north-western and north-eastern boundary of that Block to the north-western boundary of the Wairangi Native Reserve; thence following that boundary to the Ahuriri lagoon; thence following the edge of the said lagoon to the boundary of the Meanee Suburban Sections; thence following the western boundary line of the Meanee Suburban Sections to the northern boundary of Block 2; thence following that boundary to the eastern boundary of Block 52; thence following the eastern, northern, and western boundary lines of that Block to the Pakiaka creek; thence down that creek to the starting point at its junction with the Tutaekuri river.

Redcliffe District.

Starting from the western boundary line of block 1, Puketapu district, on the Tutaekuri river, up that river to its junction with the Pakiaka creek; thence following that creek, and the western, northern and eastern boundary lines of block 52 to the northern boundary of block 2; thence following that boundary to the western boundary line of block 1; thence following that boundary line to the starting point on the Tutaekuri river.

Havelock District.

Starts at the Ngaruroro River, at the north-eastern boundary of the Havelock suburban lands; thence follows up that river to the south-western corner of south suburban section of Havelock, No. 8; thence along the southern boundary of that section to the Te Aute road, and along that road to the southern boundary of the suburban sections of Havelock, and thence along the south side of the road forming the boundary of those sections to the Middle road at the south-eastern corner of suburban section 39, and thence along the south-western boundary of the suburban sections to the south-west angle of those sections; thence along the east and north-east boundaries of Havelock township to the starting point at the Ngaruroro River.

Pukahu District.

Starts at the Ngaruroro River, at the south-western corner of south suburban section of Havelock, No. 8; thence along

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the south boundary of that section to the Te Aute road; thence along that road to the south boundary of the suburban sections of Havelock, and thence along the south side of the road forming the boundary of these sections to the Middle road at the north-western corner of suburban section 39, and thence along the Middle road to the southern extremity of the Pukahu Block, at Forster's Gorge, and thence in a straight line along the boundary of the Kao Kaoroa Block and the Pukahu Block to the Awanui, across that stream to the Te Aute road, along that road to the Awanui, at Long Bridge, and down that stream to the Ngaruroro, and down the Ngaruroro to the starting point.

Papakura District.

Starts at Tareha's Bridge, follows along the Meanee road to the Tutakuri River, at the race-course, and up that river to the dry channel of the Tutakuri at Pa Whakaro, and up that channel to the Tutakuri Waimate, and down that stream to A. M'Hardy's south boundary, and follows then along his boundary fence in an easterly direction to the Te Puninga Block, and along the boundary between that block

and the Pakowhai Block to the southern boundary of the Papakura Block; thence along the southern boundary of that block to the junction of the Totara Creek with the Waitangi, and down the Waitangi to the Waitangi Bridge, and thence along the eastern boundary of the Whataangaanga Block to the starting point at Tareha's Bridge.

Pakowhai and Waitangi District.

Starts at the Waitangi Bridge, follows along the main road to the north-western boundary of the Taumata Block, and along the boundary of that block on the sea beach to the Waitangi, and down the Waitangi into the Ngaruroro, and up that river to the mouth of the Tutakuri Waimate, and up that stream to A. M'Hardy's south boundary, and along his boundary, through the Pakowhai Block, to the Te Puninga Block; thence along the boundary between the Pakowhai and the Te Puninga Blocks to the Papakura Block, and along the southern boundary of the Papakura Block to the junction of the Totara creek with the Waitangi, and down the Waitangi to the starting point at Waitangi Bridge.

I, JOHN DAVIES ORMOND, Superintendent of the Province of Hawke's Bay, by virtue of the powers vested in me, do hereby make the following regulations for the Port of Napier, and do hereby repeal all former regulations (or any part, or parts, thereof) in any wise inconsistent with the regulations hereby made:—

No person to be allowed to remove any Goods from any of the Wharves until authorized by the Wharfinger.

5. All vessels using the Government planks for shipping or discharging cargo to pay at the rate of 3 shillings per diem.
