G. F. Bush . .	Hurunui District. Bounded on the Northward by the range of Snowy Mountains; on the Eastward by the Sherwood Forest; on the Southward by the Rivers Young and Hamner; and on the Westward by the gorge formed by the Snowy Mountains descending upon the River Young.
William Robinson	Barefells Pass District. Bounded on the Northward by the range of hills to the Northward of Richmond Dale; on the Eastward by a stream called the Ouny; on the Southward by the summit of the Barefells Range; and on the Westward by the River Bourn.
A. H. Russell . .	Waiopai District. Bounded on the North East by Dr. Vickerman's boundary, and running in a South Easterly direction for about 10 miles, by an average breadth of 4 miles.
