PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act, passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that no Bill, which shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, shall have any force or authority within the Colony of New Zealand, until the Governor of the said Colony shall signify by speech or message to the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of the said Colony, or by Proclamation, that such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same:

And whereas, on the nineteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, certain Bills passed by the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of the said Colony, intituled respectively

"An Act for granting a Duty upon Gold;"

"An Act to make provision for the management of Gold-fields, in the Colony of New Zealand;"

were presented to the said Governor for Her Majesty's assent; and whereas all the said Bills were reserved by the said Governor for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the said in part recited Act, do by this Proclamation signify and proclaim to all to whom it may concern, that the said Bills have been severally laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Colony of New Zealand, at Government House, at Auckland, this twenty-second day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine.
