APPLICATIONS for DEPASTURAGE LICENSES, in accordance with the Regulations under the Waste Lands Act, 1858, received by the Commissioner of Crown Lands during the months of July, August, September, and October, 1860:—

John Holliday	District—Admiralty Bay. Bounded on the south by Hallam Cove; on the west, by a line drawn from the west corner of Hallam Cove to Dora Bay; on the north, by Admiralty Bay and Cook Strait; and on the east, by Pelorus Sound. ALTERATION OF ROAD.

Wakapuaka, October 26, 1860.

I, THE undersigned, ALEXANDER WRAGG, of Wakapuaka, in the Province of Nelson, Farmer, hereby give NOTICE that I intend to APPLY to two or more Justices of the Peace having jurisdiction in the said province, at a MEETING to be held on WEDNESDAY, the 19th day of December now next, at the Court-house, Nelson, for an Order for STOPPING-UP and DIVERTING the undermentioned ROAD: And I hereby give further notice that I will, on or before the 3rd day of November next, cause Survey Plans respectively of the Road proposed to be stopped up and of the Road proposed to be substituted for the same, together with Book of Reference containing the names of the owners, lessees, and occupiers of the lands through which the

new road is intended to pass, and the estimates of the expense of the respective works, to be deposited with the CLERK to the MAGISTRATES, and with Mr. ALEXANDER WRAGG, of Suburban North, for the District of Suburban North:—

To stop up part of a certain road in the District of Suburban North, running through Sections numbered respectively 21 and VIII. on the plan of the district, and known as map numbered 27 on the plan of the Province of Nelson, commencing at the angle of Section 21, and continuing through Section numbered VIII. in the said district.

And to substitute in the place thereof a certain other road in the said district, 75 links in width, commencing at the same point as the line proposed to be stopped up, and continuing the same width and in the direction shown on the plan accompanying the application.

ALTERATION OF ROADS.

The undersigned hereby gives notice, that he intends to APPLY to two or more Justices

of the Peace having jurisdiction within the Province of Nelson, at a sitting to be held on MONDAY, the 17th day of December now next, at the Court House, Richmond, for an ORDER for STOPPING UP and DIVERTING, and also for MAKING the undermentioned ROADS: and further, that he will cause survey plans of the several roads proposed to be stopped up, substituted, and made, together with books of reference and estimates, to be deposited, on or before the 5th day of November next, with the Clerk to the Magistrates at Richmond, and with Mr. THOMAS ANDREWS, Constable for Waimea South:—

To stop up a certain road in Waimea-south commencing at the south corner of Section 27, and proceeding through the said section 26 chains N.W., and terminating at a public road on the E. bank of the Wai-iti river, excepting the portion where the proposed substituted road will intersect this said road.

And to substitute a road 75 links wide, commencing at the S. boundary of the said Section 27, about two-and-a-half chains from its southernmost corner, and proceeding through the said section six chains N., and 11 chains W.N.W., and terminating at the aforesaid road on the E. bank of the Wai-iti: Also to continue the road from the above-mentioned intersection along the present bank of the Wairoa river 45 chains N.N.E., thence 21 chains N.W. across the said Section, and terminating at the E. bank of the Wai-iti.
