PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor JOHN PERRY ROBINSON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the Session holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, cap. 72, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of any province established by the said Act, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to fix such place or places within the limits of the Province, and such times for holding any Session of the Provincial Council as he may think fit, and from time to time in manner aforesaid to alter and vary such times and places as he may judge advisable and most consistent with general convenience:

Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested, do hereby proclaim and appoint, that the Provincial

Council of Nelson, shall meet at the Provincial Hall, Nelson, on TUESDAY, the THIRTEENTH day of MAY next, at One o'clock p.m.

A PROCLAMATION

Appointing certain Districts under the "Marriage Act."

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY,
Knight Commander of the Most
Honorable Order of the Bath,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief

in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to divide the Colony of New Zealand for the purposes of the said Act into such and so many Districts as he may think fit, and that every such District shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Registrar's District, and it is provided that the Governor may at any time revoke the whole or any part of such Proclamation and issue a new Proclamation dividing the Colony or any part of it anew into Districts or increasing the number or altering the boundaries of Districts as from time to time he may think requisite:

And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued bearing date the sixth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the Governor, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, did amongst others constitute a District for the purposes of the said Act called the "Amuri District," the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, which said Proclamation came into operation and took effect on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the said District, and to divide anew the territory formerly comprised within such District:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation so far as relates to the "Amuri District," and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such District shall be and is hereby divided for the purposes of the said Act into two Districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

Kaikoras District.

The Southern boundary of Awatere District from Barefell's Pass to the mouth of the Clarence, thence following the sea coast to the mouth of the river Tutaiputuputu or Conway, thence following that river to its source, thence running in a straight line to the confluence of the rivers Acheron and Clarence, thence by the Acheron to the confluence of the Guide, and by that stream to Barefell's Pass.

Amuri District.

The Southern boundary of last named District, from the mouth of the river Tutaiputupu or Conway to Barefell's Pass, the watershed summit between Barefell's Pass and the Wairau Gorge, thence to the Wairau Gorge, thence to Southern extremity of Lake Howick, thence to the watershed between the East and West coasts at the head of river Hurunui, thence down said river to its mouth, thence along sea coast to the mouth of the river Tutaiputupu or Conway.

And I do declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the second day of June next ensuing.

A PROCLAMATION

Appointing certain Districts under the "Registration Act."

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by the "Registration Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to divide the Colony of New Zealand for the purposes of the said Act into such and so many Districts as he may think fit, and that every such District shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Registrar's District, and it is provided that the Governor may at any time revoke the whole or any part of such Proclamation, and issue a new Proclamation dividing the Colony or any part of it anew into Districts, or increasing the number, or altering the boundaries of Districts as from time to time he may think requisite:

And whereas by a Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the sixth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the Governor, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, did amongst others constitute a District for the purposes of the said Act called the "Amuri District," the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, which said Proclamation came into operation and took effect on the First day of October, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the said District, and to divide anew the territory formerly comprised within such District:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation so far as relates to the "Amuri District," and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such District shall be and is hereby divided for the purposes of the said Act into two Districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

Kāikorā District.

The Southern boundary of Awatere District from Barefell's Pass to the mouth of the Clarence, thence following the sea coast to the mouth of the River Tutaiputupu, or Conway, thence following that river to its source, thence running in a straight line to the confluence of the rivers Acheron and Clarence, thence by the Acheron to the confluence of the Guide, and by that stream to Barefell's Pass.

Amuri District.

The Southern boundary of last-named District from the Mouth of the river Tutaiputupu, or Conway, to Barefell's Pass, the watershed summit between Barefell's Pass and the Wairau Gorge, thence to the Wairau Gorge, thence to the Southern extremity of Lake Howick, thence to the Watershed between the East and West coast at the head of the river Hurunui, thence down said river to its mouth, thence along sea-coast to the mouth of the river Tutaiputupu, or Conway.

And I do declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the second day of June next ensuing.

I, THE undersigned JOHN CHAMBERLAIN of Motueka, in the Province of Nelson, Chairman of the Road Board, of the Motueka District, hereby give notice that I intend to APPLY to two or more Justices of the Peace, having jurisdiction in the said Province, at a meeting to be held on SATURDAY, the 7th day of June now next, at the Institute, Motueka, for an ORDER for STOPPING UP the undermentioned ROAD, and to substitute a certain other road in the place thereof. And I further give notice that I have caused survey plans of the respective Road proposed to be stopped up, and the respective Road to be substituted for the same, together with the Book of Reference containing the names of the owners, lessees, and occupiers of the lands through which the intended New Road is to pass, to be deposited with the Clerk to the Magistrates and with Mr. John Boyes, Constable, Motueka.

To stop up a certain Road from the cross-road between Section 217 and 218, Motueka, proceeding due north and dividing Sections numbered 217 from 213, and Sections 215 from Sections numbered respectively 215 and 216, and terminating at the bank of the Motueka river.

And to substitute in the place thereof a certain other road in the said district 75 links in width, commencing from the said before mentioned Cross-road, and running on the western boundary of Section numbered 216 and 217, thence running due west into Section numbered 245, for 10 chains and 32 links, and thence due north through Section 215 for 10 chains and 50 links in width, and terminating at the bank of the Motueka river.

The roads are more particularly delineated in the plan attached to the notice.
