### PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor JOHN PERRY ROBINSON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

I, JOHN PERRY ROBINSON, Superintendent of Nelson, by virtue of the powers conferred on the Governor under the "Gold Fields Act, 1858" and delegated to me by an instrument under the hand of the Governor, and under the public Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July 1861, do hereby revoke a proclamation of the Governor defining the limits of the Collingwood Gold Field, and bearing date the twenty-first day of September 1860, in so far as the said Proclamation concerns the sections of land hereinafter mentioned, and do proclaim and declare that the sections of land in the Upper Takaka district numbered respectively 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, and 43, all on square number 8 of the map of the Province of Nelson, and the sections of land on Golden Bay numbered respectively 65, 66, 103, and 104, on square number 14 of the said map, shall be excluded from the limits of the said Gold Field and from the operation of the said Act.

PROCLAMATION

By JAMES A. R. MENZIES, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Southland.

**WHEREAS** His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to delegate to the Superintendent of the Province of Southland certain powers under the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," and whereas by proclamations dated on the 10th and 26th days December, 1861, respectively, published in the *Southland Provincial Government Gazette* it is amongst other things declared that the Inspector of Cattle in the Province of Southland, under the

provisions of the said Act, shall not be authorised to grant a certificate to land in the Province of Southland cattle coming from Tasmania; and whereas it is expedient to revoke this provision and make other provision in lieu thereof;

Now, therefore, I, the said Superintendent, in virtue of the power in me vested, do hereby proclaim that the Inspector of Cattle is hereby authorised to grant certificates to land in the Province of Southland, cattle coming from Tasmania; always provided that such cattle shall be free from the disease called Pleuropneumonia, and that the owner or person in charge of such cattle shall have previously given to such Inspector satisfactory proof that the cattle sought to be landed were bred in Tasmania; or were depastured in Tasmania for six consecutive months prior to their last embarkation from thence.
