PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor JOHN PERRY ROBINSON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof in Session VIII., No. 6, intituled "An Act to provide for the protection of certain animals, birds, and fishes imported into the Province of Nelson," it is amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Superintendent of the said Province for the time being, from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare that any animals, birds, and fishes already imported into the said Province, or which at any time thereafter should be imported, or such of them as he should think fit, and the increase arising therefrom should come under the operation of that Act.

Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the

power and authority vested in me by the said in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that all animals and birds of the following kinds imported into the said Province, or which shall be imported into the said Province, and the increase arising therefrom, shall come under the operation of the said Act: that is to say—

In the matter of the Debtors and Creditors Act, 1862, and in the matter of the Petition of THOMAS SMITH and GEORGE ETHERIDGE, Creditors of PHILLIP PHILLIPS, SAUL PHILLIPS, and ABRAHAM PHILLIPS, of the City of Nelson, Storekeepers.

On the Eighth day of December, 1863.

ON reading the Petition of the said Thomas Smith and George Etheridge, filed herein, and on reading the affidavit of Philip Samuel Solomon, the affidavits of Charles Henry Redhead and of George Harris, and the office copy Bill of Sale made between the said Phillip Phillips of the one part, and Maurice Harris of the
