PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor JOHN PERRY ROBINSON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the Session holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, cap. 72, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of any province established by the said Act, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to fix such place or places within the limits of the Province, and such times for holding any Session of the Provincial Council as he may think fit, and from time to time in manner aforesaid to alter and vary such times and places as he may judge advisable and most consistent with general convenience:

Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested, do hereby

proclaim and appoint that the PROVINCIAL COUNCIL of Nelson, shall meet at the **Provincial Hall**, Nelson, on TUESDAY, the TWENTY-FIRST day of APRIL next, at One o'clock, p.m.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Province, at Nelson, this Seventeenth day of March, in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three.

HIS Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified that the under-mentioned By-Law, published by the Nelson Board of Works on the 31st day of January last, has been confirmed by the Superintendent and Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of the "Nelson Improvement Amendment Act, 1858."

BY-LAW.

WHEREAS, the keeping of pigs within the populous portion of the City of Nelson is found to be a source of sickness, and a nuisance and annoyance to the public; and whereas it is desirable that such an evil should be prevented: Be it, therefore, ordered and directed by the Board of Works for the said city, with the sanction of his Honor the Superintendent and his Executive Council, as follows, viz. :—

“After the coming into operation of this By-Law, no pig or pigs shall be kept in a sty, or other inclosure, within the boundary of the city of Nelson, if such sty or enclosure shall be within twenty yards of any public road or private dwelling: and any person who, after receiving twenty-four hours' notice from the Inspector of Nuisances to remove the same, shall permit any pig or pigs to be kept on premises in his or her occupation, contrary to the provisions of this By-Law, such person shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding twenty shillings, and to a further penalty of not exceeding ten shillings per day for every day such person shall neglect to comply with the said notice.”
