PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor JOHN PERRY ROBINSON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS certain proclamations establishing Road Districts have been from time to time issued under the "Country Roads Act, 1856," and whereas it is expedient to amend, alter, and divide some of the said districts, and to publish and proclaim in a consolidated form, the boundaries of all the districts established under authority of the said Act.

Now I, JOHN PERRY ROBINSON, Superintendent of Nelson, do hereby revoke all proclamations heretofore published under the said authority, except so far as may affect the completion of any acts begun, or the claiming of any right accrued, or the recovery of any rates now due, under such proclamations, or any of them, and do declare and proclaim that on and after the FIRST day of JULY next, there shall be, for the pur-

poses of the said "Country Roads Act," the Districts following, that is to say:

Suburban North,
Waimea,
Moutere,
Motueka,
Pangatotara,
Riwaka,
Takaka,
Collingwood,

the boundaries of which districts are fully set forth hereunder:—

SUBURBAN-NORTH.

North.—A line, known as the Native Boundary line, from high water mark for a distance of five and a half miles.

East.—A line drawn in a direction south 45 deg. west (true bearing) from the extremity of the northern boundary for a distance of four miles.

South.—A line drawn from the southern extremity of the eastern boundary to the northern angle of section 21, square 23; thence along the eastern and southern boundaries of the said section, the northern boundary of section

31, Maitai, the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of section 25, square 23, the south-western boundary of section 29, square 23, the north-eastern boundary of section 27, square 23, to the eastern angle of section 61, Suburban North; thence, in a straight line, to the southern angle of section 1, Suburban North; thence along the south-western boundary of the last named section, and in the direction of the said boundary to high water mark outside the Boulder Bank.

West.—High-water mark of Blind Bay, from the point last named to the extremity of the Native Boundary line, where the boundary commences.

WAIMEA.

North.—A line drawn along high-water mark of Blind Bay from the northern extremity of section 25, Waimea West to the northern angle of section 1, Suburban South; thence along the northern and eastern boundaries of the said section 1, and the eastern boundaries of section 4, Suburban South; thence along part of the north-eastern boundaries of section 12, Suburban South, the north-eastern boundary of Sections 11, 6, and 7, in the same district, to the northern angle of section XII., Suburban South; thence across the said last named section to the northern angle of section XI., Suburban South; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of the said section XI. and of section XVIII. Suburban South, and in the same straight line as the said boundaries for two miles from the eastern angle of the said section XVIII.

South-east.—A straight line drawn from the extremity of the northern boundary last mentioned, in a direction S. 45 deg. W. (true bearing), for a distance of $23\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

South-west.—A straight line drawn from the southern extremity of the last named boundary, and at right-angles thereto, for a distance of six miles.

West and North-west.—A straight line from the western extremity of the last named boundary to the south-western angle of section 66, square 2; thence along the western side of the road forming the western boundary of the said section and of sections 1, 14, 15, and 16, Pigeon Valley, to the north-western angle of the said section 16; thence in a straight line to the south-western angle of sec-

tion 189, Moutere; and thence in a straight line to the northern extremity of the said section 25, Waimea West, where the northern boundary commences.

MOUTERE.

North-east and East.—High-water mark of Blind Bay from the mouth of the Moutere River to the northern extremity of section 25, Waimea West.

South-east.—A line drawn straight from the said northern extremity of section 25, to the south-west angle of section 189, Moutere; thence, a straight line, to the north-west angle of section 16, Pigeon Valley.

West.—A line drawn straight from the said north-west angle of section 16, Pigeon Valley, to the south-east angle of section 50, square 3; thence along the eastern boundaries of the said section 50 and of sections 49 and 48, square 3, and the north-western boundaries of sections 56, 57, 3, 2, and 4, square 3, to the western angle of section 44, Moutere; thence straight to the south-west angle of section 6, square 3, and along the western boundaries of the last named section, and of sections 28, 11, 9, and 5, Moutere, and the northern boundary of the said last named section 5; thence by the south-eastern bank of the Moutere River to its mouth, where the north-east boundary commences.

MOTUEKA.

North and North-west.—The southern bank of the Motueka River from a point opposite the north-western angle of section 215, Motueka, to the mouth of the said river.

East and South-east.—High-water mark of Blind Bay, from the mouth of the Motueka River to the mouth of the Moutere River; thence, the western bank of the Moutere River as far as the south-east angle of section 200, Motueka; thence, the southern boundary of the last named section; thence, the western boundaries of sections 5, 9, 11, 28, and 6, Moutere, to the south-west angle of the said last named sections; thence, a straight line to the western angle of section 44, Moutere; thence, the north-western boundaries of sections 4, 2, 3, 57, and 56, all of square 3; thence, the eastern boundaries of sections 48, 49, and 50, square 3, to the south-east angle of the last named section.

South.—The southern boundary of the said section 50, square 3, and the same line produced for 22 chains.

West.—A line from the western extremity of the southern boundary to the south-western angle of section 43, square 3; thence, along the western boundaries of the said last-named section, and of sections 42, and 41, square 3, to the northern angle of the said section 41; thence along the southern boundary of section 51, square 3, and in a straight line from the southern angle of the said section to the western angle of section 2, of block 1, Motueka; thence along the north-western boundary of section 2, of block 1, the northern boundary of section 1, of block 1, Motueka, the western boundaries of sections 231, 232, 234, 235, 236, 237, 238, 239, 240, 241, 242, 243, 244, 245, 215, all of Motueka, to the western extremity of the northern boundary on the banks of the Motueka River.

PANGATOTARA.

North.—A line drawn due eastwards from a point on the watershed between Blind Bay and the Takaka Valley to the north-east angle of section 56, square 9; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of the said section 56, and of sections 57 and 22 of square 9, and 4 of 62, Motueka; thence due eastwards across the public road and the River Motueka; thence along the south-east bank of the said river to the point nearest the north-west angle of section 215, Motueka; thence across the public road to the said angle of the said section.

East.—A line along the westward boundary of section 215, and of sections 245, 244, 243, 242, 241, 240, 239, 238, 237, 236, 235, 234, 232, 231, Motueka; thence along the southern boundaries of sections 260, and 2 of 33, Motueka, as far as the north-west angle of section 2 of block 1, Motueka; thence along the north-western boundary of the last named section 2 of block 1; thence in a straight line to the south-east angle of section 51, Motueka; thence, along the southern boundary of the said section 51, and the western boundaries of sections 41, 42, and 43, and in the direction of the said western boundaries produced, to a point due east of the southern angle, section 9, square 3.

South.—A line drawn due eastwards from the southern extremity of the eastern boundary through the southern angle of the said section 9, square 3, and so on due eastwards to the summit of the watershed between Blind Bay and the Takaka Valley.

West.—The watershed between Blind Bay, and the Takaka Valley, from the point last named to the commencing point of the northern boundary.

RIWAKA.

North.—A line drawn due eastward from a point on the watershed, between Blind Bay and the Takaka Valley, to the northernmost point in Torrent Basin.

East.—The high-water mark of Blind Bay from the said northernmost point of Torrent Basin to the mouth of the Motueka River.

South.—A line along the northern bank of the Motueka River to the eastern angle of section 4 of 62, Motueka; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of the said last named section, and of 22, 57, and 56, square 3: thence due westward to a point on the said watershed, between Blind Bay and Takaka Valley.

West.—The said watershed between Blind Bay and the Takaka Valley from the point last named to the commencement of the northern boundary.

TAKAKA.

North.—High-water mark of Golden Bay, from the mouth of the River Pariwhakaaho in section numbered 79, square 13, Carlyle-street in the Village of Clifton.

East.—A line drawn from the seaward end of Carlyle-street, Clifton, by the top of the spur between the said village and Pohara Bay to the summit of the watershed between the Takaka Valley and Blind Bay; thence along the summit of the said watershed to a point lying east $22\frac{1}{2}$ deg. south from Mount Snowden.

South.—A line drawn straight from the point last named to the summit of Mount Snowden.

West.—A line drawn straight from the summit of Mount Snowden to the summit of Slate River Peak; and thence straight to the mouth of the River Pariwhakaaho, where the northern boundary commences.

COLLINGWOOD.

East.—High-water mark of Golden Bay from the Sand-spit to the mouth of the River Pariwhakaaho, and a line drawn thence straight to the summit of Slate River Peak, and thence straight to the summit of Mount Snowdon.

South.—A line drawn along the summit of the watershed from the summit of Mount Snowdon to the summit of Mount Domett, and thence in a straight line to Kahurangi Point.

North-west.—High-water mark of the Pacific Ocean, from Kahurangi Point to the Sand-spit at the point where the eastern boundary commences.

ALTERATION OF ROADS.

THE undersigned hereby gives notice that he intends to apply to two or more Justices of the Peace, having jurisdiction within the Province of Nelson, at a sitting to be held on Monday the 1st of August now next, at the School-room, Lower Moutere, for an order for stopping up, diverting and also making the undermentioned roads, and further that he will cause survey plans of the several roads proposed to be stopped up, substituted, and made, together with books of reference and estimates, to be deposited on or before the 18th of June, 1864, with the Clerk to the Magistrates, at Lower Moutere, and with Mr. George Madge Taylor, Constable for the Moutere:—

To stop up a certain road in Upper Moutere, commencing at the S.E. boundary of section numbered 96, and proceeding through the said section 32 chains N.W., and terminating at the north-east side of said section (96).

Also to stop up a portion of road lying between sections numbered respectively 94, I. of 36, and 35, about 19 chains.

And to substitute, in place thereof, a certain other road, 60 links in width, commencing at the N.W. corner of section 38; thence 5 chains E., thence northwards under the hills about 85 chains through sections numbered respectively 96, 38, 375, 2 of 181, 1 of 36, and 34.

And also to make certain portions of new road in the same locality, 60 links in width, and more particularly described as follows:—The portion of road in section numbered 2 of 181, to commence at the road dividing the said section from the section numbered 95, and following the south-east boundary line of section numbered 2 of 181, 9 chains, to where it joins the proposed road and there terminating. Also, a portion of road of the same width as above, commencing at the road dividing sections numbered respectively 94 and 95, thence about 3 chains in an easterly direction to join the main road.
