PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor JOHN PERRY ROBINSON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the power in me vested, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the day of the date hereof the DISTRICT of TWO-FOLD BAY, in the Colony of New South Wales, shall be deemed to be an *Infected District* within the meaning of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," and that no Cattle shall be allowed to be imported from that District into the Province of Nelson.
