WHEREAS, by a Proclamation of His Excellency Sir George Grey, K.C.B., Governor of the Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, dated the Twelfth day of February, 1864, under the hand of the said Governor and under the Seal of the said Colony, made in execution of the powers given to His Excellency under and by virtue of the "Nelson Trust Funds Act, 1861," and the "Nelson Trust Funds Act, 1854, Amendment Act, 1863," the Resident Magistrate at Nelson was declared to be the Returning officer, at the elections for Trustees and Auditors to serve under the aforesaid Acts, and to whom all necessary powers were given by the said Proclamation for conducting all such elections: Now, therefore, I, John Poynter, Esquire, Resident Magistrate, do hereby give notice, that **MONDAY**, the **SECOND** day of **JANUARY**, 1865, is appointed for the nomination of seven persons to serve as Trustees under the said Acts from the **FIRST** day of **JANUARY** next for the then ensuing three years, and also two persons to serve as Auditors under the said Acts for the ensuing year. Such nomination to take place at Noon, at the Court House in Nelson; and in the event of a poll

being demanded, I hereby appoint **TUESDAY**, the **TWENTY-FOURTH** day of the said month of **JANUARY** for the polling to take place. The polling to commence at nine o'clock in the forenoon of the said last mentioned day, at the several and respective places to be hereafter advertised, and close at four o'clock in the afternoon of the said day at each of the said places.

APPLICATION for DEPASTURAGE LICENCES, in accordance with the Regulations under the Waste Lands Act of 1863, received by the Commissioner of Crown Lands during the month of November, 1864.

W. T. L. TRAVERS—District Rotuiti.

For all the pastoral land in the valley of the Howard and on a tributary of that stream on the east side of it, and for all pastoral land in excess of eight thousand acres within the following boundaries: on the eastward, by the line of the Big Bush; on the northward, by a line of wooded hills forming a northern continuation of the Big Bush; on the southward, by a line of wooded mountains stretching from the River Howard to the Lake Rotuiti, and from thence to the Big Bush, and on the westward, by a line drawn across the River Buller at the Devil's Grip.
