By his Honor JOHN PERRY ROBINSON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Colony of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by warrant under his hand, from time to time, to appoint Polling Places for each Electoral District within or without the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such Polling Places to be the Principal Polling Place of the district, and all or any of such Polling Places at any time to abolish, and to appoint other Polling Places in lieu thereof:

And whereas by another Act of the General Assembly intituled "The Provincial Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that, subject to certain provisions therein contained, every election of the Superintendent, or of a Member of the Provincial Council of a Province, shall be conducted in the manner prescribed by "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," aforesaid, and all the provisions of the said Act shall apply to the elections of Superintendents and Members of Provincial Councils:

And whereas, by "The Provincial Elections Act, 1858," aforesaid, it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the Colony to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province the power of appointing and removing Returning Officers, and also of appointing and abolishing Polling Places for the election of the Superintendent, or of Members of the Provincial Council of such Province:

And whereas, his Excellency the Governor of the said Colony did, by warrant under his hand, bearing date the Third day of August, 1861, delegate to me the said JOHN PERRY ROBINSON, as Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, the above recited powers:

And whereas certain places have heretofore been appointed Polling Places for the election of Members of the Provincial Council: And whereas it is expedient to abolish the same:

Now, therefore, I, the said JOHN PERRY ROBINSON, in pursuance of the powers and authority in me vested as aforesaid, do hereby abolish the Polling Places heretofore appointed for the election of Members of the Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson, and do hereby appoint in lieu thereof the fol-

lowing places to be Polling Places for the respective Districts hereinafter specified, namely:—

*For the Town of Nelson District.*

The Provincial Hall, Nelson,  
The Odd-Fellows' Hall, and  
The Office of the Board of Works.

*For the Suburban North District.*

The School-room, Suburban North.

*For the Waimea East District.*

The School-room, Richmond,  
The School-room, Suburban South.

*For the Waimea West District.*

The Southern School-room, Waimea-west

*For the Waimea South District.*

The School-room, Spring Grove,  
The School-room, Wakefield.

*For the Motueka District.*

The Motueka Institute,  
The School-room, Riwaka.

*For the Moutere District.*

The School-room, Upper Moutere,  
The School-room, Lower Moutere.

*For the Massacre Bay District.*

The Court-house, Collingwood,  
The School-room, Motupipi,  
Mr. George Taylor's House, Takaka.

*For the Amuri District.*

Mr. Duppa's Woolshed.

And I do hereby further appoint the several Polling Places hereinafter specified to be the principal Polling Places for their respective Districts namely:—

The Provincial Hall, Town of Nelson,  
The School-room, Suburban North.  
The School-room, Richmond, Waimea-

east,  
The School-room, Waimea-west,  
The School-room, Spring Grove, Waimea-

south,  
The Motueka Institute, Motueka,

**I**N pursuance of the power in me vested in that behalf by the 2nd Section of the "Vaccination Act, 1863," I hereby declare the undermentioned Districts to be *Vaccination Districts*, in the Province of Nelson, for the purposes of the said Act; viz.—

1. The Nelson District comprises the town of Nelson, the Wakatu, and the Districts of Suburban North and South, and is bounded by the sea from the Quarantine ground near Stoke to the most easterly point within the Croixelles Harbor, thence by the boundary of the Province to the Dun Mountain, thence along the same range and down the spur to the westward of Poor Man's Valley, and thence by the line of road leading to Waimea Mud Flats between Sections 76 and IV. Suburban South, and thence by the high-water mark to the Quarantine ground.

2. The Waimea East District comprises part of Suburban South District, Waimea East and the Aniseed Valley, and is bounded from the Waimea Mud Flats to the Dun Mountain by the Nelson District thence by the boundary line of the Province to Mount Rintoul, thence by the spurs of the same range to the river Lee, thence by the banks of the rivers Lee, Wairoa, and Waimea to the mouth of the last named river, and thence by high-water mark to the commencement of the district.

3. The Waimea South and West District comprises the Waimea South, Waimea West, Eve's Valley, Redwood's Valley, Wai-iti, Eighty-eight Valley, Wairoa, Upper Motueka, Motupiko and Wangapeka districts, and is bounded by high water mark from Section No. 194, Moutere, to the Mouth of the Waimea River, thence by the Waimea East district to the summit of Mount Rintoul, thence by the boundary line of the Province to the Top House, thence by the road through the Big Bush to Lake, thence by the Watershed between the basins of the Motueka and Buller, to the Mount Arthur Range, thence by the range of hills dividing the Wangapeka from the Baton to the river Motueka, thence by the range of hills dividing Stanley Brook from Dove Dale to the Castle, thence by the Watershed between Eve's and Redwood's Valleys, and the Moutere to the Red Hill, and thence by the line of road from the Red Hill to Section 194, Moutere.

4. The Motueka District comprises the

Moutere, Baton, Dove Dale, Wai-wero, Motueka, Riwaka, Sandy Bay, and Astrolabe District and is bounded by the sea from Abel Head to the mouth of the Waimea West, thence by the high water mark Waimea West mud-flat to road line section 194, Moutere, thence by the Waimea South and West District to the Mount Arthur Range, thence by the Mount Arthur Range to Mount Arthur, and thence by the Mount Arthur Range to the sea at Abel Head.

5. The Takaka District comprises the Taitapu, Motupipi, Takaka, Wai-nui, Totara-nui, and Awarua Districts, and is bounded by the Sea from Rangihacata Head, to Abel Head, thence by the Motueka District to Mount Arthur, thence by the Mountain range to Mount Domett, thence by the Mountain range to Slate River Peak, and thence by the Water-shed to Rangihacata Head.

6. The Collingwood District comprises the Milnthorpe, Collingwood, Seaford, and West Wanganui Districts, and is bounded by the Sea from the Sand Spit, to Rangihacata Head, thence by the Takaka District, to Mount Domett, thence by the Mountain range to Kahurangi Point, and thence by the Pacific Ocean to the Sand Spit.
