**HIS** Honor the Superintendent directs the publication of the following documents for general information.

*Delegation of the Governor's powers under the "Gold-fields Act, 1862," to the Superintendent of Nelson.*

By his Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Gold-fields Act, 1862," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the

Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any province or to such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said Act, except the powers conferred by Sections nineteen, thirty-one, thirty-two, thirty-three, and sixty-one, thereof, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such powers:

Now, therefore, I, SIR GEORGE GREY, the Governor as aforesaid of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate unto

ALFRED SAUNDERS, Esquire,

as Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, all the powers vested in me under and by virtue of "The Gold-fields Act, 1862," except the powers contained in sections nineteen, thirty-one, thirty-two, thirty-three, and sixty-one of the said Act, to have, hold, and

exercise within the Province of Nelson the said powers hereby given the said ALFRED SAUNDERS, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer: Provided always that copies of all Rules and Regulations, made under the delegation aforesaid, shall be forthwith transmitted to the Colonial Secretary, in order that the same may be laid before the General Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of the sixty-third clause of "The Gold-fields Act, 1862."

Given under my hand, at the Government House, at Wellington, and issued under the Seal of the Colony of New Zealand, this Twenty-eighth day of June, in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.

*Delegation of the Governor's powers under the "Gold-fields Act, 1862," to the Superintendent of Nelson.*

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c.

**W**HEREAS by section nineteen of an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Gold-fields Act, 1862," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by order in Council, from time to time to constitute for any Gold-field, or for any part thereof, Warden's Courts for the administration of Justice therein, and to appoint Wardens as Judges of such Courts with power to act alone, or with Assessors or Juries, and in such manner and to exercise to all or any of the powers thereinafter mentioned as the Governor shall think fit to direct: And whereas by the fifth section of an Act of the General Assembly intituled "The Gold-fields Act Amendment Act, 1863," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or to such other person as the Governor may deem fit, and under such restrictions as he shall think fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by section

nineteen of the said Act, and to alter or revoke by said delegation:

Now, therefore, I, Sir GEORGE GREY, the Governor as aforesaid of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate unto

ALFRED SAUNDERS, Esquire,

as Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, all the powers vested in me by the nineteenth section of "The Gold-fields Act, 1862," to have, hold, and exercise within the Province of Nelson the said powers hereby given the said ALFRED SAUNDERS, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer, and to have, hold, and exercise such powers subject to the Regulations hereunder written, namely:—

REGULATIONS.

All Acts and appointments done and made by the said Superintendent under the foregoing Delegation shall be provisional until the same shall have been confirmed and allowed by the Governor; and the Governor shall have power to disallow the same.

The Superintendent shall report without delay to the Governor all such Acts and appointments.

The Superintendent shall lay before the Provincial Council of the said Province every such Act and appointment at the Session of the said Council next following.

The Provincial Council of the said Province may, through their Speaker, transmit to the Governor any resolutions respecting any such Act or appointment.

**W**HEREAS, by the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," it was provided that the Governor in Council might by warrant under his hand from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any Province within the said Colony all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such

regulations as he might think fit, and might from time to time rescind such delegation:

Now, therefore, I, SIR GEORGE GREY, the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, do by this warrant under my hand delegate to

ALFRED SAUNDERS, Esquire,

so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the said Colony, the several powers vested in me by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth sections of the said Act, subject to be rescinded as in the said Act provided, and subject to the regulations issued on the Fifteenth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and to any other regulations to be from time to time duly made.

ALTERATION OF ROADS.

I, the Undersigned, ALEXANDER LE GRAND CAMPBELL, of Motueka, in the Province of Nelson, hereby give notice, that I intend to APPLY to two or more Justices of the Peace, having jurisdiction in the said district, at a Meeting to be held on SATURDAY, the 26th day of August next, at the Motueka Institute, Motueka, for an order for DIVERTING the undermentioned ROAD: And I hereby give further notice, that I have made a survey Plan of the road proposed to be diverted, and of the road proposed to be substituted for the same, and have lodged it with Mr. JENKINS, Constable of Riwaka, being the constable of the district in which the said road is situate:—

1. To stop up a certain road in the Riwaka, leading from the road up the Riwaka-valley, commencing at a

point 200 links or thereabouts from the swamp-bridge, and running thence in a due south direction 28 chains more or less, being the original line of road as laid out by the New Zealand Company, between sections 56 and 50, on the east, and sections 49 and 57, on the west.

And to substitute in the place thereof, a certain other road, of the same width, commencing about 150 links from the said bridge, the point of deviation being marked by a solitary manuka tree on the boundary line; proceeding thence in a direction due south for two chains or thereabouts; thence in a S.S.E. direction 150 links more or less; thence in a S.E. direction 600 links or thereabouts; thence about 500 links in a S.E. direction to the foot of the hill, joining there a private road; thence in a S.W. direction, keeping the said private road generally as the centre, till it joins the above mentioned original road, four chains from the corner boundary of section 50.
