PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor ALFRED SAUNDERS,
Esquire, Superintendent of the Pro-
vince of Nelson, in the Islands of
New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the
General Assembly of New Zealand,
passed in the Session holden in the 21st and
22nd years of the reign of her Majesty Queen
Victoria, intituled "An Act to extend the
time within which the Governor is required
to signify his pleasure on Bills passed by
Provincial Councils and reserved by Super-
intendents," it is among other things enacted
that such Bills shall not have any force or
authority within the said Province until the
Superintendent shall signify, by speech or
message to the Provincial Council, or by
proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of
the said Province, that such Bills have been
laid before the Governor, and that the
Governor has assented to the same: And

whereas certain Acts were passed by the
Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson,
Session XIV., intituled respectively—

"An Act to provide for the constitution
of new Electoral Districts and for the
election of additional members of the
Provincial Council of the Province of
Nelson."

"An Act to authorise the Superinten-
dent to lease certain lands in the
District of Motueka granted for
public purposes."

"An Act to repeal the Cattle Trespass
Ordinance, and to make other pro-
visions in lieu thereof."

"An Act to amend the Buller Reserve
Administration Act, 1863."

And the same were reserved by me for the
assent of his Excellency the Governor:

Now therefore I, the said Superintendent
of the Province of Nelson, do hereby proclaim
and declare that the aforesaid Acts have been

laid before his Excellency the Governor, and that his Excellency has assented to the same.

A PROCLAMATION

Disallowing a certain Nelson Act.

WHEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Imperial Parliament holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that whenever any bill shall have been assented to by the Superintendent, as in the said Act provided, the Superintendent shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an authentic copy thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time within three months after any such bill shall have been received by him, to declare by Proclamation his disallowance of such bill, and that any such disallowance shall make void and annul the same from and after the day of the date of such Proclamation, or any subsequent day to be named therein:

And whereas the Act hereinafter specified has been enacted by the Superintendent of Nelson, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, and the said Act was received by the Governor on the Twentysixth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Act should be disallowed:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act of Parliament, do hereby proclaim and declare my disallowance of the following Act

passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson, viz. :

"An Act to provide for the construction and maintenance of Roads and other Public Works in certain districts, Sess. XIV., No. 4."

Given under the hand of his Excellency Sir George Grey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, at the Government House at Wellington, and issued under the seal of the said colony this Twenty-first day of August, in the year of our Lord Onethousand eight hundred and sixty-six.
