**I**N exercise of the power in me for this purpose vested by "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby appoint that on and from the day of the date hereof, there shall be within the Province of Nelson a port to be called the Port of Westport, the limits whereof shall be as follows:—

All such portion of the River Buller and of its banks as is comprised within an area which shall include one mile of the river from its mouth, and a space on each bank respectively of not less than forty chains in width.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Grey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its De-

pendencies, this twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

**I**N exercise of the powers in me for this purpose vested by "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby appoint that on and from the day of the date hereof the river frontage extending from Gladstone-street to Wallaby-street, in the Town of Westport, shall be deemed and taken to be the legal landing place for the lading and unlading of goods at the Port of Westport, under "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858."

G. Browne, C.B., late Governor of the said Colony, bearing date the twenty-sixth January, 1860.
