PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor OSWALD CURTIS,
Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c.

WHEREAS certain Proclamations establishing Road Districts, have been from time to time issued under the "Country Roads Act, 1856," and whereas, it is expedient to amend and alter the boundaries of some of the districts so proclaimed as aforesaid.

Now, therefore, I, OSWALD CURTIS, Superintendent of the said Province of Nelson, by virtue of the power and authority enabling me on that behalf, do hereby *revoke* all Proclamations heretofore published, establishing or amending Boundaries of Districts under the "Country

Roads Act, 1856," except so far as may affect the completion of any acts begun, or the claiming of any right accrued, or the recovery of any rates now due under such Proclamations, or any of them, and do *declare* and *proclaim* that on and after the First day of July next, there shall be for the purposes of the said "Country Roads Act" the Districts following, that is to say:

SUBURBAN NORTH,
WAIMEA,
MOUTERE,
MOTUEKA,
PAINGATOTARA,
UPPER MOTUEKA,
RIWAKA,
TAKAKA,
COLLINGWOOD,
AMURI,

the boundaries of which districts are fully set forth hereunder.

SUBURBAN NORTH.

By the line known as the Native Boundary, from high water mark of Tasman Bay, for a distance of five and a half miles; thence by a line drawn in a direction south 45 deg. west, true bearing, for a distance of four miles; thence by a line to the northern angle of section 21 square 23, and along the eastern and southern boundaries of the said section,—the northern boundary of section 31, Maitai,—the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of section 25, square 23,—the south-western boundary of section 29, square 23,—the north-eastern boundaries of sections 27 and 61, square 23; thence along the south-eastern boundary of section 1, Suburban North, to its southern angle, and along the south-western boundary of the said section; thence in the same direction to high water mark outside the Boulder Bank; and thence by high water mark to the commencement of the district.

WAIMEA.

By the high water mark of Tasman Bay, from the northern end of the division line between sections 194, Moutere, and 26, Waimea West, to the northern angle of section 1, Suburban South; thence along the northern and eastern boundaries of the said section,—the eastern boundary of section 4, Suburban South,—parts of the north-eastern boundaries of section 12, Suburban South,—the north-eastern boundary of sections 11, 6, 7, and XII, in the said district, to the eastern angle of section XII, Suburban South; thence along the south-eastern boundary of same section to the northern angle of section XI, Suburban South, and along the north-eastern boundaries of the said section XI, and of section XVIII, Suburban South, and in the same straight line as the said boundaries for two miles from the eastern angle of the said section XVIII.

Thence a line drawn in a direction south 45 deg west, true bearing, for a distance of 23½ miles; thence a line drawn to the south-east angle of section 29, square 4, and along its southern and western boundaries; thence by the watershed to the northern end of sections 9 and 12, Wai-iti Hills, square 4; thence by a line to the eastern angle of section 135, Pigeon Valley, square 2; thence by a line to the southern angle of section 103, square 6; thence by a line to the southern angle of section 89, square 6, and by the division line between that section and section 88, to the bank of the river Dove; thence along the bank of the said river to the division line between sections 1 and 83 of square 6, and along the south-west boundary of said section 1, and the north-west boundaries of sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10, Suburban Thorpe, and by the north-eastern boundary of the said section 10; thence by a line to the northern angle of section 139, and the north-eastern boundaries of sections 139 and 108, square 2; thence by the south-western boundary of section 111, and the south-eastern boundaries of sections 111, 112, and 113, square 2, and along the north-eastern boundary of section 113, and the south-eastern boundary of section 114; thence by a line to the south-west angle of section 161, square 2; thence by a line to the southern angle of section 126, Rising Sun Valley; thence a line to southern angle of section 37, square 2, and by the western boundaries of sections 37, 38, 39, and 36, to highest point on ridge at south-west angle of section 69, square 2; thence by a line to southern angle of section 192, Moutere, and along the south-eastern boundaries of sections 192 and 194, Moutere, to high water mark.

The islands in the Waimea mud-flats to be included in this district.

MOUTERE.

By high water mark, Tasman Bay, from the mouth of the Moutere river to the northern end of the division line between sections 194, Moutere, and 26, Waimea West; thence by the south-eastern boundaries of sections 194 and 192, Moutere, to the southern angle of section 192; thence by a straight line to the highest point of the ridge at the south-western angle of section 69, square 2, and along the western boundaries of sections 36, 39, 38, and 37, square 2, to the southern angle of section 37; thence a straight line to the south-east angle of section 126, Rising Sun Valley; thence by a line to the south-west angle of section 161, square 2; and thence by a straight line to the eastern angle of section 114, square 2; thence by a line to the north-western angle of section 82, square 3; thence by a straight line to the south-eastern angle of section 50, Waiwhero, and along the eastern boundary of the said section 50, and of sections 49 and 48, and the south-western boundary of section 56, and the north-western boundaries of sections 56 and 57, Waiwhero, and of sections 3, 2, and 4, of square 3, to the western angle of section 44, Moutere; thence by a line to the south-west angle of section 6, square 3, and along the western boundaries of sections 6, 28, 11, 9, and 5, and the northern boundary of section 5, to the bank of the Moutere river; and thence by the south-eastern bank of the Moutere river to its mouth.

To include the islands at the mouth of the Moutere river in this district.

MOTUEKA.

By the southern bank of the Motueka river, from a point opposite the north-western angle of section 215, Motueka, to the mouth of the said river; thence by high water mark, Tasman Bay, from the mouth of the Motueka river to the mouth of the Moutere river; and along the western bank of the Moutere river to the south-eastern angle of section 200, Motueka; thence by the southern boundary of the said section, and the western boundaries of sections 5, 9, 11, 28, and 6, Moutere, to the south-western angle of section 6; thence a line to the western angle of section 44, Moutere, and along the north-western boundaries of sections 4, 2, 3, 57, and 56, of square 3,—a portion of south-western boundary of section 56, and the eastern boundaries of sections 48, 49, and 50, of square 3, to the south-eastern angle of section 50; thence by a line to north-western angle of section 82, square 3; thence by a line to south-western angle of section 47, Waiwhero, and along the western boundaries of sections 47, 45, 44, 43, 42, and 41, square 3, to south-western angle of section 51, and by the southern boundary of section 51; thence by a line to south-western angle of section 2 of block 1, and along the north-western boundary of same section; thence along northern boundary of section 1, of block 1, and the western boundaries of sections 231, 232, 234, 235, 236, 237, 238, 239, 240, 241, 242, 243, 244, 245, and 215, Motueka, to the southern bank of the Motueka river.

All the islands in the river Motueka to be included in this district.

PAINGATOTARA.

By a line drawn due east from a point on the watershed between Tasman Bay and Golden Bay, to the northern angle of section 62, square 9, and along the north eastern boundaries of the said section, and of sections 56, 57, and 22, of square 9, and 4 of 62, Motueka; thence by a line due eastward across the public road and the Motueka River, and along the southern bank of the said river to a point nearest the north-western angle of section 215, Motueka; thence

across the public road, and along the western boundaries of sections 215, 245, 244, 243, 242, 241, 240, 239, 238, 237, 236, 235, 234, 232, 231, Motueka, and along the northern boundary of section 1, of block 1, to the north-west angle of section 2, of block 1, Motueka, and along the north-western boundaries of the last-named section; thence by a line to the south-eastern angle of section 51, Motueka, and along the southern boundary of the said section, and the western boundaries of sections 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, and 47, to south-western angle of section 47; thence by a line to the north-western angle of section 82, square 3; thence by a line to the eastern angle of 114, square 2; and along the south-eastern boundaries of the said section, the north-eastern boundary of section 113, the south-eastern boundaries of sections 113, 112, and 111, square 2, the south-western boundary of section 111, and north-eastern boundaries of sections 108 and 139; thence by a line to the eastern angle of section 10, Thorpe Suburban; thence along the north-east boundary of same section 10, and the north-eastern boundaries of sections 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1, Thorpe Suburban; thence by the division line between section 83, square 6; and 1, Thorpe Suburban, to the banks of the river Dove, and along the banks of the said river to the north-west angle of section 88, square 6, and along the division line between sections 88 and 89; thence by a line to the southern angle of section 103, square 6, and along its southern boundary to the banks of the river Motueka, and along the banks of the said river to a point opposite the mouth of the river Baton; thence by a line due west to the water shed, and by the water shed of the Motueka river to the point from which the description of these boundaries commences.

UPPER MOTUEKA.

By a line dividing sections 103 and 104, square 6; thence by a line to western angle of section 135, Pigeon Valley, square 2; thence by a line to the northern angles of sections 9 and 12, Wai-iti Hills, square 4, and along the watershed to the north-western angle of section 29, square 4, and the western and southern boundaries of the said section; thence by a line to the most southern angle of the Waimea district; thence by a line to the south-eastern angle of section 17, square 45, and thence by prolongation of the same line for a distance of five and a-half miles; thence by a line touching the south-western angle of section 22, Rainy River, square 35, and of section 17, Wangapeka, square 5, and prolonged in the same straight line to a point eight and a-half miles due west of the mouth of the river Baton; thence by a line drawn due east through the mouth of the river Baton to the eastern bank of the river Motueka, and along the banks of the said river to a point opposite the dividing line between sections 103 and 104, square 6, being the point from which the description of these boundaries commences.

RIWAKA.

By a line drawn due eastward from a point on the watershed between Tasman Bay and Golden Bay to the northern point of section 36, Torrent Basin, square 10, and along the high water mark of Tasman Bay to the mouth of the river Motueka, and following the northern bank of the said river to the eastern angle of section 4 of 62, Motueka, and along the north-eastern boundaries of section 4 of 62, and 22, 57, 56, and 62, of square 9; thence due westward to a point on the watershed between Tasman Bay and Golden Bay, and along the said watershed to the point from which these boundaries commence.

The islands at the mouth of the Riwaka river to be included in this district.

TAKAKA.

By the high water mark of Golden Bay from the mouth of the river Pariwhaka-aho, in section numbered 79, square 13, to Carlyle-street, in the village of Clifton; thence by the top of the spur between the said village and Pohara Bay to the summit of the water shed between Golden Bay and Tasman Bay, and along the summit of said watershed to a point lying east $22\frac{1}{2}$ degrees south from Mount Snowdon; thence by a line drawn to the summit of Mount Snowdon; thence by a line drawn to the summit of Slate River Peak, and thence by a straight line drawn to the mouth of the river Pariwhaka-aho, whence the description of these boundaries commences.

The islands at the mouths of the rivers Takaka and Motupipi to be included in this district.

COLLINGWOOD.

By a line drawn from the mouth of the river Paturau to the northern angle of section 3, of block 1, square 15, and along the north-eastern boundary of the said section to the banks of the river Aorere; thence in the same direction across the said river and along its southern bank to high water mark, Golden Bay, and along high water mark, Golden Bay, to the mouth of the river Pariwhaka-aho, in section 79; thence by a line drawn to the summit of Slate River Peak, and along the water shed to the summit of Mount Snowdon, and along the water shed to Mount Domett; thence by a straight line drawn to Kahurangi Point, and thence by the high water mark of the Pacific Ocean from Kahurangi Point to the mouth of the Pariwhaka-aho, being the point from whence the description of these boundaries commences.

This district to include the islands in the river Aorere.

AMURI.

By a line from the Top House to the summit of St. Arnaud Mount; thence by a line drawn to the summit of Mount Princess; thence by a line drawn to the banks of Lake Sumner, at a point about two miles from the head of the lake, and along the northern bank of the lake to the river Hurunui, and by the northern bank of the river to the sea; thence by the coast line to the mouth of the river Conway, and along the banks of that river to its source; thence by a line to the confluence of the rivers Acheron and Clarence, and along the banks of the Acheron to the confluence of the Guide, and along the banks of the river Guide to Barefells Pass, and thence by a line drawn to the Top House, being the point from where the description of these boundaries commences.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor OSWALD CURTIS,
Esquire, Superintendent of the Province
of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS certain Proclamations have been from time to time issued under "The Country Roads Act, 1856", declaring certain lines of Road to be Trunk Roads for the purposes of the said Act. And whereas it is expedient that those Proclamations should be revoked and fresh lines of Road proclaimed to be Trunk Roads under the said Act.

Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, by virtue of the power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby *revoke* all Proclamations heretofore published, declaring certain lines of Road to be Trunk Roads, and *proclaim* and *declare* the lines of Roads hereinafter described to be TRUNK ROADS, for the purposes of the said "Country Roads Act."

PROVINCIAL TRUNK LINES.

To commence from the line known as the Native Boundary Line, being the north-eastern boundary of section numbered 38 Happy Valley-square 23, and to continue along the road now in use to the south-western boundary of section numbered 1 Suburban North, Square 23.

To commence at the limit of the city of Nelson and to continue along the track now in use up the valley of the Maitai, over the Saddle Hill and terminating at the Heringa.

To commence from the north-eastern boundary of section 6 Suburban South Square 1, and to continue along the line of road now in use passing through the village of Richmond, thence to the bridge over the Wairoa, thence through the villages of Spring Grove, Lower and Upper Wakefield, and Fox Hill, thence by the valley of the Wai-iti over the ranges and down Ray's Valley to the Motueka Valley, and up that valley to M-Farlane's, thence up the Long Valley and over the range to the Motupiko, and thence through the Big Bush to the accommodation-house kept by Mr. Wiesenhavern.

To commence at King's Corner, Lower Wakefield, and to continue along the line of road now in use through the 98 valley and Quail Valley until it joins the line of road leading from Fox Hill to the top house.

To commence from the line of road running through the valley of the Wai-iti and to take the line of road now in use over Spooner's Range, and down Norris' valley to the valley of the Motueka, and down that valley to the place known as Ram's Flat.

To commence from the line of road in section numbered 70 Motueka Valley, and to continue along the line of road now in use up the valley of the Tudmor and over the range to the Sherry, and across the plain to the banks of the River Wangapeka.

To commence from the main line of road at the corner of section 7 Waimea South square 2, and to continue along the line of road now in use up the valley known as Pigeon Valley, and over the ranges to Stanley Brook, and down the valley of the Stanley to sections numbered 110 and 111 on square

6, and thence over the range to the river Motueka at section numbered 122 Motueka Valley square 6.

To commence from the line of road leading up the Pigeon Valley to Stanley Brook, and to take the line of road now in use up the right hand branch of the Pigeon Valley and thence over the hills to the Dove Dale-road.

To commence at the port of West Waimea and to take the line of road now in use to the Roman Catholic Reserve on section 60, and by the same line of road to the gravel reserve near the Horse and Jockey, thence southward to the west corner of section 165 Waimea West, thence along its south side and across the Wai-iti, and along the road now in use through section 65 Waimea South to the trunk line from Nelson to Fox Hill.

To commence from the line of road known as Tomlinson's road Waimea West, and to continue along the line of road now in use up Eve's Valley and over the saddle, and to the village of Thorpe, and by a continuation of the same line of road down the valley of the Dove to the road leading up the valley of the Motueka.

To commence from the main line of road between sections 72 and 73 square 2, and to take the line of road now in use leading over the saddle into the Wild Boar Valley, and down that valley, and continuing along the same line of road until it joins the main line of road at the Upper Moutero between sections 96 and 4 on square 3.

To commence at the main line of road known as Tomlinson's road, and to take the line of road laid out through section 154 Waimea West to the bank of the river Wai-iti, thence across the Wai-iti and along the road known as White's road to Dixon's corner.

To commence from the south-eastern boundary of sections numbered 108 and 110 Waimea East square 1, and to continue along the line of road now in use through the village of Appleby, thence over the river Waimea from section 200 Waimea East to section 10 Waimea West, thence by the same road through the villages of Upper and Lower Moutero to section 165 Motueka district square 3, thence along its southern and eastern boundaries, and passing through the village of Motueka and over the rivers Motueka and Riwaka, and by the same line of road to Mr. Cook's and over the Takaka ranges to the southern boundary of section numbered 19 square 8, and to continue along the line of road now in use across the rivers Takaka and Waingarua to the landing place at the Waitapu.

To commence from the main line of road leading from Appleby to Motueka, and to take the line of road now in use through section numbered 187 Waimea East to the banks of the river Waimea, thence across the said river in the direction of Redwood's-gate, and thence along the line of road to the gravel reserve at the south-west angle of section 60 Waimea West.

To commence from the main line of road between sections numbered 172 and 199 Motueka district square 3, and to continue along the line of road now in use over the ranges and crossing the valley of the Waiwhero, and thence to the river Motueka at a point below the junction of the Orinoco Stream with that river, and thence along the line of road now in use leading up the valley of the Motueka to the mouth of the river Baton.

To commence from the main line of road at section 67 square 3 Orinoco Valley, and to continue along the line of road now in use until it strike the main line of road in the village of Thorpe.

To commence at the jetty at Motueka and to continue along the line of road now in use to section

165 Motueka district, and to continue along the same line of road to the banks of the river Motueka at section 250 Motueka district, and thence by the line of road leading up the valley of the Motueka to the Orinoco Stream.

To commence from the main line of road near the school-house Riwaka district, and to continue along the line of road now in use to the landing place for the Riwaka district.

To commence from the jetty at Motueka and to take the line of road now in use through the native reserve section to Thorpes-road, and thence by Thorpe's and Greenwood's roads to the trunk line of road in the village at Giblin's corner.

To commence from the line of road in section numbered 6, on Square 8, and to continue along the line of road now in use, and known as the East Takaka road, to Boyle-street in the Village of Clifton.

To commence from the line of road in section numbered 163, on Square 11, and to take the line of road between sections numbered 161 and 164 to the river Motupipi, and thence to the line of road leading to the Motupipi jetty.

To commence from the line of road between sections numbered 109 and 115, on Square 11; and to take the line of road now in use through sections 109, 29, 22, and 21, to the line of road leading to the Motupipi jetty.

To commence from a point on the line of road in section numbered 21, on Square 11, and to take the line of road now in use through sections numbered 18, 9, and 5; and to continue on the same line of road to the landing-place at the mouth of the river Motupipi.

To commence from the line of road at section numbered 137, on Square 11, district of the Takaka; and to continue along the line of road now in use to the Court-house, Collingwood, as the same line of road is drawn on Squares numbered 11, 13, and 14.

To commence from the Court-house, Collingwood, and to continue along the line of road now in use, by the way of Appoo's Flat to Golden Gully.

To commence from the Court-house, Collingwood, and to continue along the line of road now in use, through the town of Collingwood and Collingwood Suburban, to the ford over the river Aorere, in section numbered 13, on Square 14, and thence across the river, and along the line of road drawn on Square 14, to the south-westward boundaries of sections numbered 106 and 116, on the said Square.

To commence from the jetty on Gibbs' Flat, and to continue along the line of road now in use along the beach, to the town of Collingwood, through the said town and Collingwood Suburban, and a continuation of the same road to Washbourn's Flat, Slate river.

To commence at the Accommodation House, near the Big Bush, kept by Mr. Wiesenhavern, and to continue along the line of road now in use leading up the Wairau Gorge to Tarndale, thence by the same line of road, through the Valleys of the Alma, Acheron, and Clarence, to the foot of Jollie's Pass; thence by Jollie's Pass to the Hanmer, and along the same line of road over the Pahau, and to the proposed site for the bridge over the Hurunui.

To commence at the main line of road in Tarndale, and to continue along the line of road now in use to Lake Tennyson; thence by Maling's Pass to the Dillon; and thence by the Valley of the Dillon, to its junction with the Hope.

To commence at the main line of road on the Hanmer Plain, and to continue along the line of road now in use up the Valleys of the Dillon and Hope; and thence by Kiwi Creek to Lake Marion, and on to Lake Sumner.

To commence from the banks of the Conway, and to continue along the line of road now in use, and leading over the Whale's Back and Mount Cookson; and thence to the Mason, thence down the Valley of the Mason to the Dillon, thence over the Dillon and along the foot of the Isolated Hills, and by the same road to the site for the proposed bridge over the Hurunui.

To commence from the banks of the Conway, and to continue along the line of road now in use, leading across Mr. Caverhill's run; thence over the river Dillon, and by the same line of road across the Cheviot Hill run to the banks of the Hurunui.

To commence from the main line of road in the Valley of the Mason, and to continue along the line of road now in use across the runs of Messrs. Tinline and Rutherford; and thence by the Leslie Pass to the line of road in the Hanmer Plain.
