#### RATES OF PILOTAGE.

##### STEAMERS.

Not exceeding 50 tons, 4d. per ton on 50 tons.  
From 50 to 150 tons, 4d. per ton.

From 150 to 250 tons, 4d. per ton on 150 tons, and 2½d. per ton on excess over 150 tons.

From 250 to 400 tons, 3½d. per ton on 250 tons, and 2d. per ton, on excess over 250 tons.

Exceeding 400 tons, 3d. per ton on 400 tons, and 1½d. per ton on excess over 400 tons.

Steam vessels entering the harbour more than once during any calendar month to pay half the above rates each time of entrance and departure after the first.

##### SAILING VESSELS.

From 50 to 200 tons, 4d. per ton.

„ 200 „ 400 „ 5d. „ „

Exceeding 400 „ 6d. „ „

Vessels towed into Harbor by steamer shall be entitled to a reduction of one-fourth from the above Rates.

##### HARBOUR MASTER'S FEES,

For the removal of any steamer or sailing vessel from one anchorage to another, or from one wharf or part of a wharf to another wharf or part of a wharf, ONE PENNY per ton, from 50 to 250 tons; and one HALF-PENNY per ton from 250 tons and upwards.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At Wellington, the twenty-eighth day of June, 1867.

Present:

THE PRESIDENT AND MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Gold-fields Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, from time to time to constitute for any Gold-field, or for any part thereof, Wardens' Courts for the administration of justice therein, and to appoint Wardens of such Courts with power to act alone or with assessors, and in such manner and to exercise all or any of the powers hereinafter mentioned as the Governor shall think fit to direct:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him for this purpose, appoint

JAMES ROGER DUTTON, Esq.,

to be a Warden of all Wardens' Courts now constituted or hereafter to be constituted within the Nelson South-west Gold-fields, with power to him to act alone or with assessors, and to exercise all or any of the powers vested in or imposed on Judges of Wardens' Courts.
