PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor OSWALD CURTIS, Esquire,  
Superintendent of the Province of  
Nelson, in the Islands of New Zea-  
land, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, passed in the Session holden in the 21st and 22nd years of the reign of her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to extend the time within which the Governor is required to signify his pleasure on Bills passed by Provincial Councils and reserved by Superintendents," it is among other things enacted that such Bills shall not have any force or authority within the said Province until the Superintendent shall signify, by speech or message to the Provincial Council, or by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, that such Bills have been laid before the Governor, and that the Governor has assented to the same: And whereas the following Act, passed by the

Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson, Session XVI, intituled:—

"An Act to authorise the Superintendent to guarantee Interest upon the Capital to be expended in the construction of a Patent Slip or Dry Dock at the Port of Nelson,"

And the same was reserved by me for the assent of his Excellency the Governor:

Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, do hereby proclaim and declare that the aforesaid Act has been laid before his Excellency the Governor, and that his Excellency has assented to the same.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Nelson, this Eighteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the twenty-sixth day of October, 1867.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Goldfields Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, from time to time to constitute for any Goldfield, or for any part thereof, Wardens' Courts, for the administration of justice therein, and to appoint Wardens of such Courts with power to act alone or with assessors, and in such manner and to exercise all or any of the powers thereinafter mentioned as the Governor shall think fit to direct:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony doth hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him for this purpose, appoint

JOSEPH GILES, Esq.,

to be Warden of all Wardens' Courts now constituted or hereafter to be constituted within the Nelson South-west Goldfields, with power to him to act alone or with assessors, and to exercise all or any of the powers vested in or imposed on Judges of Wardens' Courts.

This appointment to date and take effect from the tenth day of October, 1867.
