PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor OSWALD CURTIS, Esquire,
Superintendent of the Province of Nelson,
in the Islands of New Zealand,
&c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Legislative Council of New Munster, in Session 1, No. 9, intituled "An Ordinance to increase the efficiency of the Constabulary Force," it is amongst other things enacted that the provisions of that Ordinance may be proclaimed in force within the limits of any Town, upon a requisition to that effect from a majority of the Magistrates of the District in which such Town is situate: And WHEREAS a majority of the Magistrates of the District in which the Town of Mohikinui is situate have requested that the provisions of the said recited Ordinance should be enforced in that District:

Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, pursuant to the power and authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act, and by an Ordinance passed by the Provincial

Council of Nelson in Session 1, No. 2, intituled "An Ordinance to vest in the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson certain powers heretofore vested in the Governor and Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Munster," do hereby proclaim and declare that the aforesaid Ordinance passed by the Legislative Council of New Munster, in Session 1, No. 9, shall, from and after the publication hereof, be in force over an area comprised within a circle described by a radius of two miles from the Lock-up of the Town at Mohikinui, within the limits of the Nelson South-west Gold-fields.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Nelson, this Fourth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

NOMINATION OF TRUSTEES UNDER
THE "NELSON TRUST FUNDS
ACT."

WHEREAS, by a Proclamation of his Excellency Sir George Grey, K.C.B., Governor of the Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, dated the 12th day of February, 1864, under the hand of the said Governor, and under the Seal of the said Colony, made in execution of the powers given to his Excellency under and by virtue of the "Nelson Trust Funds Act, 1861," and the "Nelson Trust Funds Act, 1854, Amendment Act, 1863," the Resident Magistrate, at Nelson, was declared to be the Returning Officer, at the Election for Trustees and Auditors to serve under the aforesaid Acts, and to whom all necessary powers were given by the said Proclamation for conducting all such Elections: Now, there-

fore, I, John Poynter, Esquire, Resident Magistrate, do hereby give notice, that THURSDAY, the 2nd day of January, 1868, is appointed for the Nomination of Seven Persons to serve as Trustees under the said Acts, from the 1st day of January next, for the then ensuing three years, such Nomination to take place at Noon, at the Court House, in Nelson; and, in the event of a Poll being demanded, I hereby appoint TUESDAY, the 21st day of the said month of January, for the Polling to take place. THE undermentioned APPLICANTS for LEASES of CROWN LANDS are hereby informed that "The Crown Lands (Nelson) Leasing Act, 1867," having come into operation on the 10th October, "The Crown Land (Nelson) Leasing Act, 1865," was thereby and from that date repealed; and that consequently, before leases can be issued in their favor, it is necessary that they should comply with the provisions of the 5th section of the Act of 1867, by PAYMENT of the FEE as therein required, and which section is to the following effect:—

"All persons desiring leases of unoccupied portions of Crown Lands not suitable for agricultural purposes, shall lodge with the Commissioner an application and description thereof, in the form, or to the effect of Schedule A thereto, and shall at the time of lodging such application pay to the Commissioner a fee of five pounds for any quantity not exceeding one thousand acres, and a further fee of five pounds for each additional one thousand acres, or fractional part of one thousand acres, and shall also pay a deposit of sixpence an acre towards the expense of the survey for every acre of land so applied for. The amount of such deposit to be placed to the credit of the applicant towards the payment of his

rent, in the event of the issue of a lease."
