PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor OSWALD CURTIS, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, passed in the Session holden in the 21st and 22nd years of the reign of her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to extend the time within which the Governor is required to signify his pleasure on Bills passed by Provincial Councils and reserved by Superintendents," it is among other things enacted that such Bills shall not have any force or authority within the said Province until the Superintendent shall signify, by speech or message to the Provincial Council, or by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, that such Bills have been laid before the Governor, and that the Governor has assented to the same: And whereas the following Act, passed by the Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson, Session XVII intituled:—

An Act to amend "An Act to provide

for the constitution of New Electoral Districts, and for the election of additional Members of the Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson," passed in Session XIV., No. 1; and also further to provide for the election of additional Members for the Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson,

and the same was reserved by me for the assent of his Excellency the Governor:

Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, do hereby proclaim and declare that the aforesaid Act has been laid before his Excellency the Governor, and that his Excellency has assented to the same.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Nelson, this Twenty-third day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

THE SUPERINTENDENT directs it to be notified that the undermentioned BY-LAWS made and passed by the Nelson Board of Works, regulating the STANDS for HACKNEY CARRIAGES plying for hire within the City of Nelson, have been CONFIRMED by the Superintendent and Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of the 16th section of "The Nelson Improvement Amendment Act, 1858."

BY-LAWS FOR REGULATING THE STANDS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES PLYING FOR HIRE WITHIN THE CITY OF NELSON.

Hackney Carriages plying for hire in the City of Nelson shall stand for hire at such places only as the Board of Works shall from time to time appoint for that purpose by notice in the *Government Gazette*, and in some newspaper published in the said city.

Carriages shall take their stations on the stands in the order of their arrival, and when any carriage shall be called or driven off any stand, the carriage immediately behind shall draw up to the place vacated, and any other carriage behind in like order. No Carriage or Horse shall stand so as to obstruct the foot-path or crossing-place.

Any person committing a breach of these by-laws shall be liable to a Penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings.

The following places shall be STANDS for Hackney Carriages plying for hire:—

1. The centre part of Trafalgar-street, north of Bridge-street.
2. The centre of Collingwood-street, north of Bridge-street.
3. The west side of the road at the Port, between the Government Wharf and the Albion Hotel.
4. The west side of the Haven road, between the Custom-house and the Panama Company's offices, for the Heavy Goods Carriages, such stand to be 3 feet from the curb-stone, or water-table.
