ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington,
the twenty-third day of May, 1868.

Present:

THE COLONIAL SECRETARY, PRESIDING, AND
THE MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE
COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, by "The Protection of
Animals Act, 1867," it is enacted
that the Governor may, by Order in Council,
published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, dele-
gate to the Superintendent of any Province
all or any of the powers by the said Act
vested in the Governor or the Governor in
Council, subject to such regulations as he
may think fit, and may from time to time
rescind such delegation:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Gover-
nor, by and with the advice and consent of
the Executive Council, doth hereby delegate
unto

OSWALD CURTIS, Esq.,

Superintendent of the Province of Nelson,
so long as he shall continue and remain
Superintendent of the said Province, all the
powers vested by the said Act in the Gover-
nor or the Governor in Council, to be
exercised only in respect of the said Province.

PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor OSWALD CURTIS, Esquire,
Superintendent of the Province of Nel-
son, in the Islands of New Zealand,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by "The Protection of
Animals Act, 1867," it is provided
that no GAME shall be Hunted, Shot, Taken,
or Killed in any part of Colony until the
same shall have been proclaimed as open for
that purpose: Now, therefore, I, OSWALD
CURTIS, Superintendent of the Province of
Nelson, in exercise of the power and
authority in me vested in that behalf, do
hereby proclaim and declare that the
Districts of RIWAKA, MOTUEKA, PANGATO-
TARA, UPPER and LOWER MOUTERE, as
constituted under the authority of the
Education Act, shall be open for the pur-
pose of SHOOTING PHEASANTS during
the month of July next, by persons duly
licensed, under the above recited Act.

One thousand eight hundred and
sixty-eight.

LICENSES to SHOOT PHEASANTS within the Districts of RIWAKA, MOTUEKA, PANGATOTARA, UPPER and LOWER MOUTERE, during the month of July next, will be issued at this Office on Payment of the Fee of One Pound.

The following Clause of "The Protection of Animals Act, 1867," is published for general information:—

"18. No person shall take, kill, or pursue, or aid, or assist in any manner in the taking, killing, or pursuing by any means whatsoever, or use any dog, gun, net, or other engine for the purpose of taking, killing, or pursuing any game until such person shall have taken out a License to kill game under this Act, and paid the duty hereby made payable thereon, and if any person shall offend against the provisions of this Section he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, and in default of payment to be imprisoned for a period not exceeding four months."
