PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor OSWALD CURTIS, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

IN accordance with the Provisions of "The Marine Act, 1867," and in pursuance of the power and authority delegated to me by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, I, OSWALD CURTIS, Superin-

tendent of the Province of Nelson, hereby make the following Harbor Regulation for the Port of Buller, on the West Coast, and declare that the same shall come into operation and take effect from and after the date hereof:—

Regulation

No drift wood shall be removed, without the permission of the Harbor-Master, from any land of the Crown, within one mile from the mouth of the River Buller, and any person removing the same shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor OSWALD CURTIS, Esquire,
Superintendent of the Province of
Nelson, in the Islands of New Zea-

WHEREAS by of "The Nelson Scab Act, 1868," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the Province, to fix and declare the boundaries of the District of Amuri, and of any other District or Districts, for the purposes of the said Act, and such boundaries from time to time in like manner to alter and amend as occasion may require:

Now, therefore, I, OSWALD CURTIS, Superintendent of the said Province, hereby proclaim, fix, and declare that, on and after this date, all the land comprised within the following boundaries shall be the District of Amuri for the purposes of "The Nelson Scab Act, 1868:—

The Hurunui river, from its mouth to Lake Sumner; from Lake Sumner to the Saddle between the Hurunui and the Tere-makau; thence in a straight line to Mount Princess; thence in a straight line to Lake Tennyson; thence following the River Clarence to its junction with the Acheron; thence by the boundary of the Marlborough Province to the mouth of the Conway; and from the mouth of the Conway by the sea coast to the mouth of the Hurunui.
