SAMUEL JOHN LORING is hereby authorised, under the provisions of Section XIII of "The Goldfields Act, 1866," to keep a Ferry Boat on the Totara River, and charge tolls, from the 1st January until the 31st December, 1870, as per schedule, on the following conditions:—

1. That a competent Ferryman be always in attendance, with a good safe boat and proper rope for crossing horses.
2. That all Government Officers, including road overseers, laborers, and postmen, when on duty, shall be ferried across the said river free of charge.

This protection shall not be transferred without the consent in writing of the Warden of the district.

The Warden of the district shall, on being satisfied that the Ferry service is not conducted in a proper and efficient manner and in accordance with the above conditions, have power to suspend the operation of this protection until the matter of complaint be removed.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Auckland, this  
eleventh day of February, 1870.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Goldfields Act, 1866," it is  
enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor  
in Council from time to time to constitute for any Gold-  
field, or for any part thereof, Wardens' Courts, for the  
administration of justice therein, and to appoint Wardens  
of such Courts, with power to act alone or with asses-  
sors, and in such manner, and to exercise all or any of  
the powers hereinafter mentioned, as the Governor  
shall think fit to direct:

And whereas by certain Proclamations, dated re-  
spectively the eighth day of June, one thousand eight  
hundred and sixty-eight, and the ninth day of February,  
one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and respec-  
tively published in the Provincial Government Gazette  
of the Province of Nelson on the eighth day of June,  
one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and the  
ninth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and  
seventy, the portions of the colony therein mentioned  
were constituted a goldfield under the name of "The  
Nelson South-west Goldfields:—"

And whereas it is expedient that Wardens' Courts  
should be constituted in and for the said goldfield:

Now therefore his Excellency the Governor, in pur-  
suance and exercise of the said power and authority,  
doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the  
Executive Council of New Zealand, order that Wardens'  
Courts at Westport, Charleston, Brighton, Cobden,  
Ahaura, Camptown, and Wangapeka, within the said  
goldfield, shall be and the same are hereby constituted

for the goldfield constituted by the hereinbefore recited Proclamations of the eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and of the ninth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, respectively, for the administration of justice therein, and doth hereby appoint

CHARLES BROAD, Esq.,  
JOSEPH GILES, Esq., and  
CALEB WHITEFOORD, Esq.,

to be Wardens of such Courts, with power to act alone or with assessors, and in such manner as is provided by the said Act, and to exercise all such powers as are mentioned in the said Act, and which the Governor by the said Act has power to direct to be exercised by Wardens.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Auckland, on the eleventh day of February, 1870.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Goldfields Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, from time to time to constitute for any goldfield, or for any part thereof, Wardens' Courts, for the administration of justice therein, and to appoint Wardens of such Courts, with power to act alone or with assessors, and in such manner, and to exercise all or any of the powers thereafter mentioned, as the Governor shall think fit to direct:

Now therefore his Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him for this purpose, appoint
