PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor OSWALD CURTIS, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand.

WHEREAS, by a certain Proclamation, bearing date the Third day of August, 1867, and issued under my hand as Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, certain Districts were proclaimed under the Provisions of "The Country Roads Act, 1856," to be Road Districts for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to alter and amend the Boundaries therein described of the Districts of

SUBURBAN NORTH,
PANGATOTARA, and
UPPER MOTUEKA:

Now, therefore, I, OSWALD CURTIS, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, by virtue and in exercise

of the powers and authorities in me vested in that behalf, do hereby REVOKE such portions of the above-mentioned Proclamation as relate to the Boundaries of the Districts of Suburban North, Pangatotara, and Upper Motueka, and DECLARE and PROCLAIM that from and after this date, the Boundaries of the Districts above-named shall be as follows:—

DISTRICT OF SUBURBAN NORTH.

By a straight line from the point of land between Oananga and Omakau, at high-water mark, Tasman Bay, to the summit of the Castor Peak; thence, southerly, along the top of the range, being the boundary between the Provinces of Nelson and Marlborough, to the northern summit of the Saddle Hill; thence by a straight line, to the northern angle of Section 21, Square 23, and along the eastern and southern boundaries of the said Section, the northern boundary of Section 31, Maitai, the northern and north-western boundaries of Section 25, Square 23, the south-western boundary of Section 29, Square 23; thence along the south-eastern boundary of Section 1, Suburban North, to its southern angle,

and along the south-western boundary of the said Section; thence in the same direction, to high-water mark, to the said point between Oananga and Omakau.

DISTRICT OF PANGATOTARA.

By a line drawn due east from a point on the watershed between Tasman Bay and Golden Bay, to the northern angle of Section 62, Square 9, and along the north-eastern boundaries of the said section, and of Sections 56, 57, and 22, of Square 9, and 4 of 62, Motueka; thence by a line due eastward across the public road and the Motueka River, and along the southern bank of the said river to a point nearest the north-western angle of Section 215, Motueka; thence across the public road, and along the western boundaries of Sections 215, 245, 244, 243, 242, 241, 240, 239, 238, 237, 236, 235, 234, 232, 231, Motueka, and along the northern boundary of Section 1, of Block 1, to the north-west angle of Section 2, of Block 1, Motueka, and along the north-western boundaries of the last-named section; thence by a straight line to the south-eastern angle of Section 51, Motueka, and along the southern boundary of the said section, and the western boundaries of Section 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, and 47, to the south-western angle of Section 82, Square 3; thence by a line to the eastern angle of Section 114, Square 2; and along the south-eastern boundaries of the said section, the north-eastern boundary of Section 113, the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 113, 112, and 111, Square 2, the south-western boundary of Section 111, and north-eastern boundaries of Sections 108 and 139; thence by a line to the eastern angle of Section 10, Thorpe Suburban; thence along the north-east boundary of of same, Section 10, and the north-eastern boundaries of Sections, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1, Thorpe Suburban; thence by a division line between Section 83, Square 6, and 1, Thorpe Suburban, to the banks of the River Dove, and along the banks of the said river to the north-west angle of Section 88, Square 6; and along the division line between Sections 88 and 89; thence by a line to the southern angle of Section 103, Square 6, and along its southern boundary to the banks of the River Motueka, and along the banks of the said river to a point opposite the mouth of the river Baton; thence by a line due west to the watershed; thence by a straight line to the junction of the Leslie with the Karamea; thence by a straight line to the south-western angle of the Takaka Road District; thence by the southern and part of the eastern boundary of the said Takaka District to the said first mentioned point on the watershed between Tasman and Golden Bay.

DISTRICT OF UPPER MOTUEKA.

Commencing at the south-eastern angle of the Waimea District; thence along the south-western boundary of the said District, and along the southern boundary of the Pangatotara District to its south-western angle; thence by a straight line to the western angle; thence by a straight line to the Saddle between the sources of the rivers Wangapeka and Karamea; thence by a straight line to the junction of the Maruia with the Buller; thence by a straight line to the summit of Mount Franklin and a prolongation of that line to the western boundary of the Amuri District; thence along that boundary to the old Top House; thence by a straight line to the

south-eastern angle of the Waimea District, from whence this description commences.

JOHN MOLLOY is hereby authorised, under the Provisions of Section XIII of "The Goldfields Act, 1866," to keep a Ferry Boat on the Totara River, and charge tolls, from the 1st January until

the 31st December, 1871, as per schedule, on the following conditions:—

1. That a competent Ferryman be always in attendance, with a good safe boat and proper rope for crossing horses.
2. That all Government Officers, including road overseers, laborers, and postmen, when on duty, shall be ferried across the said river free of charge.

This protection shall not be transferred without the sanction of the Superintendent.

The Warden of the district shall, on being satisfied that the Ferry service is not being conducted in a proper and efficient manner, and in accordance with the above conditions, have power to suspend the operation of this protection until the matter of complaint be removed.
