PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor OSWALD CURTIS, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand.

WHEREAS, by an Ordinance passed by the Legislative Council of New Munster, in Session I, No. 9, intituled "An Ordinance to increase the efficiency of the Constabulary Force," it is amongst other things enacted that the provisions of that Ordinance may be proclaimed in force within the limits of any town, upon a requisition to that effect from a majority of the Magistrates of the District in which such Town is situate: And WHEREAS a majority of the Magistrates of the District in which the Town of REEFTON is situate have requested that the provisions of the said recited Ordinance should be enforced within the District hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, pursuant to the power and authority vested in me in that behalf by the said

recited Act, and by an Ordinance passed by the Provincial Council of Nelson, in Session I, No. 2, intituled "An Ordinance to vest in the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson certain powers heretofore vested in the Governor and Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Munster," do hereby proclaim and declare that the aforesaid Ordinance passed by the Legislative Council of New Munster, in Session I, No. 9, shall from and after the publication hereof, be in force over an area comprised within a circle described by a radius of one mile from the Lock-up in the Town of REEFTON, Inangahua District, within the limits of the Nelson South-west Goldfields.

RULES FOR INTERMENT IN THE DOVE-DALE CEMETERY.

1. THAT the exclusive right of burial in any plot of ground in this Cemetery be purchaseable, at the rate of five shillings per square yard, payable at the time of selection of the site, failing which the same to remain open for selection.

2. That no burial-plot shall be less than nine feet in

depth, nor contain less than four square yards, viz: nine feet by four feet.

3. That no person shall hold more than eight of such plots.

4. Persons not desirous of purchasing the exclusive right of burial may cause burials to take place by paying to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings for each such interment in addition to the usual burial fees.

5. Applicants for burial plots, exclusive or otherwise, can select any spot in any section on application to the Secretary or any person duly authorised, who is hereby empowered to mark off the same on payment of the sum fixed by the regulations.

6. Each plot is to be staked off at the four corners with durable stakes at least one foot above the level of the ground.

7. The holders of any plots of burial ground shall observe such rules with regard to enclosing, fencing, and decent maintenance of the same as shall from time to time be laid down by the Trustees.

8. The top of any coffin deposited in any part of the Cemetery shall not be less than four feet below the natural level of the soil.

9. It shall be at the option of persons using the ground for interment to engage and pay such persons as they prefer either for the burial service or the interment.
