PROTECTION is hereby Granted, under the provisions of the Goldfields Act, 1866, to JOHN MAUNDER LANGDON, for the term of Four years from the date hereof, for a Punt Ferry across the Inangahua River, about 5 miles from the junction of the rivers Buller and Inangahua, at the crossing of the new road to Reefton, subject to the following conditions, viz.—

1. That a substantial Punt, capable of carrying at least twelve tons, shall be placed on the River at the site named, within two months from this date, and maintained in good working order during the term of protection.
 2. That a competent ferryman shall be always in attendance, and the ferry shall be at all times conducted to the satisfaction of the Warden of the district.
 3. The Warden of the district may, on being satisfied that the ferry is not conducted in an efficient manner, and in accordance with these conditions, suspend the operation of this protection until the matter of complaint be removed; and if the matter of complaint be not removed within a reasonable time, the Superintendent shall have the power to cancel this protection.
 4. The Government to have the option, at any time during the term of protection, of purchasing the punt and works connected therewith, at a valuation without any consideration for loss of good will.
 5. In the event of this protection being cancelled under the provision of clause 3 hereof, the said John Maunder Langdon, or his assigns, shall not be entitled to any payment or compensation excepting for the actual value of the punt, and the Superintendent shall have power to take immediate possession of the punt and works connected therewith.
 6. The tolls to be charged for the use of the punt shall not exceed the following, viz.—

7. This protection shall extend along the river for a distance of two miles, that is to say one mile each side of the site of the punt.
 8. This protection shall not have any effect or operation until the punt has been placed on the river in good working order, to the satisfaction of the Provincial Engineer.

9. All Regulations which may at any time be brought into force under section 13 of "The Goldfields Act, 1866," shall be deemed applicable to this protection as if it had been granted under the same.
10. This protection shall not be transferred without the sanction of the Superintendent.
