PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor HENRY ADAMS, Esquire, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands, of New Zealand, &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, passed in the Session holden in the 21st and 22nd years of the reign of her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to extend the time within which the Governor is required to signify his pleasure on Bills passed by Provincial Councils and reserved by Superintendents," it is among other things enacted that such Bills shall not have any force or authority within the said Province until the Superintendent shall signify, by speech or message to the Provincial Council, or by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, that such Bills have been laid before the Governor, and that the Governor has assented to the same: And whereas certain Acts were passed by the Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson, in Session XXII., intituled respectively:—

"An Act to amend an Act to determine the number of members of the Provincial Council

and to appoint Electoral Districts in the Province of Nelson:"

"An Act to repeal an Act to authorize the Superintendent to Sell or Lease certain Lands, granted for public purposes, situated in the District of Amuri in the Province of Nelson, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof:"

And the same were reserved for the assent of his Excellency the Governor:

Now, therefore I, the said Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, do hereby proclaim and declare that the aforesaid Acts have been laid before his Excellency the Governor, and that his Excellency has assented to the same.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Nelson, this Third day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1871," it is amongst other things, enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation to be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, may from time to time establish and define such and so many districts as he shall think fit to be districts under the said Act, and to each such district there shall, in the Proclamation defining it, be attached such name as the Governor shall think fit, and by which name it shall thereafter be called, and that every such district may from time to time in like manner be altered or constituted anew in such manner as the Governor may think fit:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand aforesaid, in pursuance and exercise of the above recited power and authority, do hereby define all that tract of country comprising the Electoral Districts of the City of Nelson, the Suburbs of Nelson, Waimea, Motueka, and Collingwood, as and to be a District under and for the purposes of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1871," and in further pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Act, I do hereby attach to the said district the name of "The Northern Nelson District;" and lastly, I do hereby declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the twenty-second day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

Given under the hand of his Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House, at Wellington; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, this thirteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

A PROCLAMATION.

Given under the hand of his Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House at Wellington; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, this thirteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.
