PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor OSWALD CURTIS, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued under my hand bearing date the Sixteenth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and published in the Nelson Provincial Government Gazette, No. 19, of the 17th June, 1873, the District of Pangatotara, as constituted under "The Nelson Highways Act 1872," was divided into Sub-districts for the purposes of the said Act, and whereas it is desirable to alter the boundaries of the said Sub-districts.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Oswald Curtis, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, pursuant to and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me in that behalf, by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the Proclamation hereinbefore described, and Proclaim and declare that the said District of Pangatotara shall

be divided into the following Sub-districts from and after the date hereof, that is to say:—

1. Pangatotara
2. Nga Timoti
3. Oronoko

And the boundaries of such Sub-districts shall be as follows:—

1. PANGATOTARA.

On the North by the Riwaka Road Board district; on the East by the Motueka district; on the West by Crown Land; on the South by a line commencing at the division line between sections 43 and 44, square 3, and continuing in a straight line westward along the northern boundary of sections 14, 64, 63, and through 21 to the river Motueka; thence across the river and along its western bank to the northern angle of section 10; thence to the southern angle of section 9 by the north-eastern boundary of sections 27, 55, 90, and 95; thence by a straight line due west to the boundary of the Pangatotara Road Board district.

2. NGA TIMOTI.

On the North by the Pangatotara sub-district; West by Karamea river; South by Upper Motueka Road Board district; East by a line from the western angle of section 63, square 3, to the north-west boundary of section 25, thence by the north-west boundary of sections 25, 23, and 101, to the western angle of section 101; thence by the western boundary of sections 23, 52, 36, 37, 38, and 40, to the division line of sections 40 and 41; thence in a straight line to the southern angle of section 69; thence by the southern boundary of sections 69 and 49, to the Motueka river; thence by the Motueka river to the boundary of the Upper Motueka Road Board district.

3. ORONOKO.

On the North partly by the Pangatotara sub-district, and partly by the Nga Timoti sub-district; on the East partly by the Motueka Road Board district, and partly by the Moutere Road Board district; on the South by the Waimea and Upper Motueka Road Board districts; and on the West by the Nga Timoti sub-district.

And each such sub-district shall elect two members of the Board for the district.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Province, at Nelson, this Thirtieth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.
