PROTECTION FOR BULLER TOWING PATH
CANCELLED.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Protection
granted by me, under the provisions of "The
Goldfields Act 1866," bearing date the fourteenth day
of August, 1871, and published in the *Nelson Pro-
vincial Gazette*, No. 24, of the 21st August, 1871, to
the BULLER TOWING TRACK COMPANY (Limited),
for a TOWING PATH to be constructed up the Buller
River, from Garden Island on the south bank of the
Buller to the Junction of the River Inangahua is
hereby CANCELLED, and all rights of the said Company
to charge Tolls for the use of the said Towing Path
cease from and after this date.

PROTECTION is hereby Granted, subject to the following conditions, for Five Years from this date under the provisions of "The Goldfields Act 1866," to LOUIS PENSINI for a TRAMWAY to be constructed by him from the Landing at the Junction of the Rivers Buller and Lyell to the Lyell Township, and the said Louis Pensini is hereby authorised, subject also to the following conditions, to charge the Tolls hereinafter specified during the term of this Protection, viz :—

1. Situation of line to be approved by the Provincial Engineer.
2. The Tramway to be commenced within one month from this date, and completed, to the satisfaction of the Provincial Engineer, by the 30th day of November, 1873, and must be kept in good working order and repair during the whole of the term to the satisfaction of the Provincial Engineer.
3. Tolls on Goods conveyed along the said Tramway shall not exceed Seven Shillings and Sixpence per Ton.
4. The Superintendent reserves the right to cancel this protection at any time during the said term of five years, if any of the above conditions are not carried out to his satisfaction, and in the event of any complaint arising, the Superintendent may suspend the operation of this protection until the matter has been enquired into and decided upon.
5. Should this protection be cancelled, as provided by clause 6 hereof, the said tramway shall become the property of the Provincial Government, and the Superintendent shall have the right to immediate possession thereof; and the said Louis Pensini shall not be entitled to any compensation or payment for the same.
6. The right is reserved to the Government to construct a road, tramway, or other means of communication at any time during the said term of five years between the said Landing and Township without paying any compensation to the holder of this protection.
7. This protection shall not be transferred or assigned without the sanction in writing of the Superintendent.
