**I**N exercise of the power in me for this purpose vested by the Bankruptcy Act 1867, and the Bankruptcy Act Amendment Acts 1868, 1870.

I hereby appoint that the Newspaper published at Reefton, called

“THE INANGAHUA HERALD,”

shall be the Gazette for the purpose of the said Acts from and after the First day of February next, for such part of the Judicial District of Nelson appointed under the Supreme Court Act 1860, as is included within the boundary following:—

Commencing at the summit of Mount Faraday, thence by a straight line to the junction of the Ohikanui and Buller Rivers, thence by the Eastern Watershed of the Papahaua Mountains to a point due West of Mount Owen, thence by a straight line to the sum-

mit of Mount Owen, thence by a straight line to the junction of the Buller and Rotoroa Rivers, thence by a straight line to the summit of Mount Princess, thence by a straight line drawn in the direction of the Saddle between the Hurunui and Teramakau Rivers to a point due East (magnetic) of Mount Gore, thence by a straight line to the summit of Mount Gore, thence by the Watershed between the Rivers Inangahua and Mawheraiti to the Saddle between the said rivers, thence by a straight line to the summit of Mount Faraday, the commencing point.

**T**HE Superintendent directs it to be notified that it is the intention of the Government to proclaim and declare the 9th and 10th sections of "The Nelson Scab Act 1868," to be in operation throughout the Province of Nelson on and after the 1st day of January, 1874, excepting only that portion of the Nelson South-west Goldfields comprised within the following boundaries, viz.—

Commencing at the mouth of the river Grey on the sea coast; thence by the sea coast to the mouth of the river Karamea; thence up the Karamea river to a point known as the Karamea Bend; thence in a straight line to the junction of the rivers Wangapeka and Dart; thence in a straight line to the junction of the rivers Buller and Hope; thence following the boundary of the Nelson South-west Goldfields to the boundary of the County of Westland; thence by the boundary of the said County to the source of the river Arnold; thence by the rivers Arnold and Grey to the sea coast.

**T**HE Superintendent directs it to be notified that it is the intention of the Provincial Government to proclaim and declare that on and after the 1st day of May, 1873, the undermentioned boundaries shall be the boundaries of the Amuri district for the purposes of "The Nelson Scab Act, 1868," and "The Nelson Scab Act Amendment Act, 1869;" and that the 9th and 10th sections of the Nelson Scab Act, 1868," shall come into operation within the said boundaries hereinafter described, on and after the said 1st day of May, 1873, viz.—

From the mouth of the Hurunui River to Lake Sumner; from Lake Sumner to the saddle between the Hurunui and Teremakau; thence

Northward by the boundary of the Nelson South-west Goldfields to Mount Franklyn; thence by the western watershed of the Wairau river to the Tophouse; thence by the boundary between the Provinces of Nelson and Marlborough to the mouth of the river Conway; thence by the sea coast to the mouth of the river Hurunui.
