PROCLAMATION.

By his honor, OSWALD CURTIS, Superintendent, of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the Session holden in the 15th and 16th years of the reign of her Majesty Queen VICTORIA, cap. 72, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of any province established by the said Act, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to fix such place or places within the limits of the province, and such times for holding any Session of the Provincial Council, as he may think fit, and from time to time, in manner aforesaid, to alter and vary such times and places as he may judge advisable and most consistent with general convenience:—

Now, therefore, I, the SUPERINTENDENT of the Province of Nelson, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested, do hereby proclaim and appoint that the PROVINCIAL COUNCIL of Nelson shall meet at the PROVINCIAL HALL, Nelson, on TUESDAY, the 29th day of APRIL next, at Twelve o'clock Noon.

PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor, OSWALD CURTIS, Superintendent, of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

I, OSWALD CURTIS, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in exercise of the power and authority in me vested in that behalf, do hereby Proclaim and Declare that from and after the First day of April next, the following Regulation shall come into force on the Nelson South-West Goldfields, and shall form part of the Rules and Regulations thereof now in force thereon:—

BEACH CLAIMS.

Beach claims shall mean all claims extending below highwater mark on the sea beach.

Such claims shall in all cases be deemed to be extended to the sea, although their boundaries in that direction be not marked by pegs, and although the area so held be greater than could be held without this Regulation, and this Regulation shall not interfere with any power which the Warden may otherwise have to grant extended claims of any kind upon the beach.

The Warden shall have power at any time to rectify the boundaries of beach claims, or to define a base line to which the side boundaries shall be at right angles as nearly as circumstances permit.

Beach claims shall not interfere with any traffic along the beach, nor with the discharge of water, tailings, or other matters thereon, provided that the Warden shall have power to prevent, or regulate, the discharge of such water, tailings, or other matters.

RULES FOR INTERMENT IN THE WEST-PORT CEMETERY.

THAT the exclusive right of burial in any plot of ground in this Cemetery be purchasable at the rate of six shillings per square yard, payable at the time of selection of the site.

2. That no burial plot shall be less than nine feet in depth, nor containing less than four square yards, viz—nine feet by four feet.

3. That no person shall hold more than eight such plots.

4. Persons not desirous of purchasing the exclusive right of burial, may cause burials to take place by payment to the Secretary of the Trustees the sum of ten shillings for each such interment, in addition to the usual burial fees.

5. Applicants for burial plots, exclusive or otherwise, can select any plot in any of the denominational sections, on application to the Secretary, or any person duly authorised, who is hereby empowered to mark off the same on payment of the sum fixed by the regulations.

6. Each plot is to be staked off at the four corners with durable stakes at least one foot above the level of the ground, and each plot so marked off to be numbered.

7. The holders of any plots of burial ground shall observe such rules with regard to enclosing, fencing, and decent maintenance of the same, as shall from time to time be laid down by the Trustees.

8. The top of any coffin deposited in any part of the cemetery shall not be less than five feet below the natural level of the soil.

9. All graves shall be dug by some person duly appointed by the Trustees.
