NOTICE is hereby given, that at a Meeting of the Nelson City Council, to be held on Friday, the 18th day of December, 1874, at 6.30 p.m., at the Council Chamber, Nelson, it will be proposed by Councillor Burn that the Corporation of the City of Nelson do raise the sum of Two Thousand Pounds (£2000), by loan, upon the security of a Special Rate; such Special Rate not to exceed three-pence in the pound of the annual value of the property liable to be rated, such loan to bear interest at the rate of £6 per cent per annum, and to be applied for the purpose of defraying the cost of sewerage works, the principal and interest due upon the several debentures to be payable by half-yearly instalments upon the first day of August and the first day of February in each year, at the Bank of New Zealand, in Nelson.

PROTECTION is hereby granted, under the provisions of the "Goldfields Act, 1866," to John Williams, of Fern Flat, for the term of two years from the date hereof for a ferry-boat across the Left-hand Branch of the Inangahua River, about three and a half miles from Reefton, subject to the following conditions, viz.:—

1. That a substantial boat shall be placed on the river at the site named within two months from this date, and maintained in good working order during the term of protection.
2. That a competent ferryman shall always be in attendance, and the ferry shall be at all times conducted to the satisfaction of the Warden of the district.
3. The Warden of the district may, on being satisfied that the ferry is not conducted in an efficient manner, and, in accordance with these conditions, suspend the operation of this protection until the matter of complaint be removed, and, if the matter of complaint be not removed within a reasonable time, the Superintendent shall have the power to cancel this protection.

4. The tolls to be charged for the use of the ferry-boat shall not exceed the following, viz.:—

5. This protection shall extend along the river for a distance of two miles, that is to say, one mile each side of the site of the ferry.

6. All regulations which may at any time be brought into force under section 13 of the "Goldfields Act, 1866," shall be deemed applicable to this protection, as if it had been granted under the same.

7. This protection shall not be transferred without the sanction of the Superintendent.
