PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor OSWALD CURTIS, Superintendent
of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of
New Zealand, &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson, intituled, "The Nelson Highways Act, 1872," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent from time to time to constitute and appoint certain Districts in which the said Act shall come into operation and the limits of such districts; from time to time to alter, as occasion shall require, and to make such other provisions as he shall think necessary for carrying into effect the said Act. And whereas certain Districts have been constituted under the said Act, called respectively the Pangatotara District, the Moutere District, the Motueka District, and the Riwaka District: And whereas it is necessary that provisions should be made for carrying into effect the said Act by consolidating the whole of the said Districts into one District under the said Act.

Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, pursuant to and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the limits of the several District hereinbefore mentioned, namely:--The Pangatotara District, the Moutere District, the Motueka District, and the Riwaka District, as constituted under the said Act respectively, shall be, and such limits are hereby, altered so that the whole of the said Districts shall be consolidated into and form one

certain District, which District I do hereby constitute and appoint to be called the Motueka District, in which the said Act shall come into operation; and the limits of the Motueka District so constituted and appointed I hereby declare to be as follows:—

Bounded on the northward by the Takaka District, from Mount Snowdon in an easterly direction to the dividing range between the East and West Coast, thence along the dividing range to a point due west of Torrent Basin, thence in a direct line east to Torrent Basin, thence by the Coast southward to section 194, square 2, thence by the eastern boundary of said section 194 and section 192, thence to the eastern corner of section 69, thence by eastern boundary of said section 69, western boundaries of 36, 39, 38, and 37, thence in a straight line to eastern corner of section 188, square 2, thence along boundary between sections 188 and 173, thence in a straight line to section 126, thence along southern boundary of said section 126, thence in a straight line to south-west corner of section 161, thence in a straight line to south-east corner of section 114, square 2, thence along south-east boundary of said section 114 to section 113, thence south-east along said section 113 to its south-east corner, thence south-west along boundaries of sections 113, 112, and 111, thence to north corner of section 139, thence westerly to south-east corner of section 10 Thorpe Suburban to northern

corner of said section, thence along north-western boundaries of sections 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 Thorpe Suburban to section 83, square 6, thence south-east to River Dove, thence along the River Dove to a point opposite north-eastern corner of section 89, square 6, thence crossing the River Dove to said corner of section 89, thence along said section to its south-east corner, thence in a straight line to south-east corner of section 103, thence along boundary of said section to River Motueka, thence along eastern bank of said river to a point opposite the junction of the River Baton, thence crossing River Motueka to said point of junction south bank of Baton, thence in a line due west to the dividing range between East and West Coasts, thence in a straight line to the junction of the River Leslie with the Karamoa, thence in a straight line to Mount Snowden, where this description commences.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that all rates made by the several Boards of the Pangatotara District, the Moutere District, the Motueka District, and the Riwaka District, as heretofore constituted and existing under the said Act, and being and remaining unpaid on the 28th day of June 1874, shall be deemed to be rates due and payable to the Board for the time being of the Motueka District as hereby constituted, and any such rates may be collected, sued for, and recovered in the same manner as if made by the Board of the Motueka District, as hereby constituted, and remaining in arrear.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor OSWALD CURTIS, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Colony of New Zealand, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson intituled "The Nelson Highways Act, 1872," it is amongst other things enacted that for the purpose of electing members of the Board for any District it shall be lawful for the Superintendent from time to time if he shall think fit by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to divide any District or Districts into Sub-Districts, and to apportion the number of members for the whole District between such Sub-Districts as he shall think proper. And whereas a certain District has been constituted under the said Act called the Upper Motueka District. And whereas by a certain proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of June, 1874, and issued under my hand as Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, the said District was divided into two Sub-Districts therein particularly mentioned and described. And whereas it is expedient that the said Proclamation should be revoked, and that the said District should be divided into three Sub-Districts.

Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, pursuant to, and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation of the eighteenth day of June, 1874, and proclaim and declare that the Upper Motueka District shall be divided into the following Sub-Districts, that is to say:—

1. STANLEY BROOK.
2. TADMOR.
3. MOTUPIKO.

And the boundaries of such Sub-Districts shall be as follows:—

1. STANLEY BROOK.

Commencing at the South-Western corner of section 103, square 6; thence to the Southern corner of said section; thence in a straight line to the North-Western angle of section 135, square 2; thence in a straight line to Nicholson's Well; thence by the dividing range between Stanley Brook and the River Motueka to the Northern angle of section 52, square 6; thence by the Eastern boundary of said section to Northern angle of section 70; thence by North-Western boundary of said section to the River Motueka; thence by the River Motueka to the point of starting.

2. TADMOR.

Commencing at the North-Western angle of section 70, square 6, following the division line between 70 and 71, and the Northern boundary of 52 to its Northern angle; thence by the dividing range to Nicholson's Well; thence by the Wai-iti Hills to the South-Western corner of section 29, square 4; thence by the Southern boundary of the said section to its South-East angle; thence in a straight line to the South-East angle of the Waimea District; thence in a straight line to the source of the Motupiko; thence following the range to the junction of the Hope and Buller; thence in a straight line to the range at the source of the Tadmor; thence by the dividing range between the Tadmor and Motupiko to the North-Western corner of section 87; thence by the Northern boundary of said section to the River Motueka, and thence across the river; and thence to the point of starting, being the North-West angle of section 70.

3. MOTUPIKO.

Commencing at the South-West angle of the Pangatotara District near the source of the Baton; thence in a straight line to the mouth of the Baton; thence by the River Motueka to the North-East corner of section 87, square 5; thence to the North-West corner of the said section; thence to the dividing range between the Tadmor and Motupiko; thence by the said range to the source of the Tadmor; thence in a straight line to the junction of the Hope and Buller Rivers; thence in a straight line to the saddle between the Wangapeka and Karamoa; thence in a straight line to the point of starting, being the summit of range near the source of the River Baton.

And each such Sub-District shall elect two members of the Board for the District.
