PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor OSWALD CURTIS, Superintendent
of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of
New Zealand, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson, intituled "The Nelson Highways Act, 1872," it is amongst other things enacted that there shall be a Board for each District, which, after the first Monday in July, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, shall consist of six members to be elected as therein provided, any three of whom shall form a quorum. Provided always that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to increase the number of any members for any District to eight if he should think fit. And whereas a certain district has been constituted under the said Act called the Motueka District. And whereas it is expedient that the number of members for such District should be increased to eight.

Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, pursuant to and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the number of the members of the Board for the Motueka District as constituted under the said Act shall be, and the same is hereby increased to eight.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor OSWALD CURTIS, Superintendent
of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of
New Zealand, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Nelson, intituled "The Nelson Highways Act, 1872," it is amongst other things enacted that for the purpose of electing members of the Board for any District it shall be lawful for the Superintendent from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to divide any District or Districts into Sub-Districts as he shall think proper. And whereas a certain District has been constituted under the said Act called the Motueka District.

Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, pursuant to and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act do hereby proclaim and declare that the said District shall be divided into the following Sub-Districts, that is to say:—

1. RIWAKA,
2. MOTUEKA,

3. LOWER MOUTERE,
4. UPPER MOUTERE,
5. PANGATOTARA,
6. NGATIMOTI.

The boundaries of such Sub-District shall be as follows:—

1. RIWAKA.

Commencing at a point on the dividing range between the east and west coasts due west of Torrent Basin; thence due east to Torrent Basin; thence south by the coast line to the mouth of the River Motueka; thence by the Motueka River to the east corner of section 4 of 62, square 9; thence along the north-east boundaries of 4 of 62, 22, 57, 56, and 62, square 9; thence due west to the dividing range between the east and west coasts; thence following the dividing range to the point of starting due west of Torrent Basin.

2. MOTUEKA.

Commencing at the western corner of section 215, square 9; thence north-easterly following the south bank of the River Motueka to the coast; thence south following the coast line to the mouth of the River Moutere; thence by the River Moutere to the south-east corner of section 200, square 3; thence to the south-west corner of said section; thence by the western boundaries of sections 5, 9, 11, 28, and 6, square 3; thence in a straight line to the north corner of section 4, square 3; thence along the north-west boundaries of sections 4, 2, 3, 57, and 56, square 3; thence by the south-west boundary of section 56, and the eastern boundaries of sections 48, 49, and 50; thence in a straight line to western angle of section 82; thence in a straight line to the south-west angle of section 47; thence by the western boundaries of sections 47, 45, 44, 43, 42, and 41; thence to the south-east angle of section 51; thence in a straight line to the south-west angle of 2 of 1, square 3; thence by the northern boundary of 1 of 1 to the south-west angle of 231, square 3; thence by the western boundaries of sections 231, 232, 234, 235, 236, 237, 238, 239, 240, 241, 242, 243, 244, 245, to the point of starting.

3. LOWER MOUTERE.

Commencing at the mouth of the River Moutere; thence by the coast line to the south-east angle of section 45, square 3; thence along the north side of the public road between sections 30 and 31 to its junction with the road on the eastern boundary of section 27; thence in a straight line to the south-eastern angle of section 159; thence along the north side of the public road to the southern angle of section 158; thence in a straight line through section 35 to the northern angle of section 94; thence along the northern boundary of sections 94, 92, and 90; thence in a straight line across section 82 and along the northern boundary of sections 85, 144, 142, 140, 137, and 75; thence in a straight line to the south east angle of section 49, square 3; thence by the eastern boundaries of sections 49 and 48;

and the western boundaries of sections 56, 57, 8, 2, and 4 to the western angle of section 44; thence in a straight line to section 6; thence by western boundaries of sections 6, 28, 11, 9, and 5; thence by southern boundary of section 200; thence by River Motueka to the point of starting.

4. UPPER MOUTERE.

Commencing at the mudflat of the Waimea entrance at the eastern angle of section 45, square 3; thence along the north side of the public road between sections 30 and 31 to its junction with the road on the eastern boundary of section 27; thence in a straight line to the eastern angle of section 159; thence along the north side of the public road to the southern angle of section 158; thence in a straight line through section 35 to the northern angle of section 94; thence along the northern boundary of sections 94, 92, and 90; thence in a straight line across section 82, and along the northern boundary of sections 85, 144, 142, 140, 137, and 75; thence in a straight line to the south-east angle of section 49, square 3; thence southerly by the western boundary of section 50, square 3; thence in a straight line to north-west angle of section 82, square 3; thence in a straight line to eastern angle of section 114, square 2; thence in a straight line to the south-western angle of section 161, square 2; thence in a straight line to south-eastern angle of section 126, square 2; thence in a straight line following boundary between sections 188 and 173 to southern angle of section 37; thence by the western boundaries of sections 37, 38, 39, and 36; thence in a straight line through section 69 to its north-eastern angle; thence in a straight line to southern angle of section 192; thence by eastern boundaries of sections 192 and 194 to the mudflat; thence by the coast line to the point of starting.

5. PANGATOTARA.

Starting from southern corner of section 43, square 3; thence westerly to the Road to Ngatimoti; thence following south-eastern side of said road to Motueka River; thence across the said River, continuing along the western bank to its junction with the Pokororo River; thence up the Pokororo to the western boundary of section 55; thence to the southern corner of section 90; thence to the western corner of section 95; thence to the northern corner of the said section; thence by a line due west to the dividing range between the East and West Coasts; thence following the said range north-easterly for five miles; thence in a straight line to northern angle of section 62, square 9; thence by north-eastern boundaries of sections 62, 56, 57, 22, and 4 of 62, square 9; thence crossing the River Motueka to its eastern bank; thence to north-western angle of section 245, square 9; thence by the western boundaries of sections 245, 244, 243, 242, 241, 240, 239, 238, 237, 236, 235, 234, 232, and 231; thence by the northern boundary of section 1 of 1, and western boundary of section 2 of 1; thence in a

straight line to south eastern angle of section 51, square 3; thence to south-western angle of said section 51; thence by western boundaries of sections 41, 42, and 43 to point of starting.

6. NGATIMOTI.

Bounded on the northward by the Takaka District from Mount Snowdon, running in an easterly direction to the dividing range between the East and West Coasts; thence along the range northerly to a point due west of the north-eastern angle of section 95, square 7; thence along the said line to said angle; thence by the northern boundary of said section to its north-western corner; thence by the western boundaries of sections 95, 90, and 55 to the River Pokororo; thence by the River Pokororo to the River Motueka; thence by the River Motueka to the eastern angle of section 10, square 7; thence crossing the River Motueka to the Ngatimoti Road; thence following the south and eastern sides of said road to a point west from south corner of section 43, square 3; thence to the said corner; thence by western boundaries of sections 44, 45, and 47; thence in a straight line to north-western corner of section 82; thence in a straight line to northern corner of section 114, square 2; thence by south-eastern boundaries of sections 114, 113, 112 and 111; thence in a straight line to north-eastern corner of section 139, square 2; thence in a straight line to south-eastern angle of section 10, Thorpe Suburban; thence to northern angle of said section 10; thence by north-western boundaries of sections 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1, Thorpe Suburban; thence to the River Dove by western boundary of section 1, Thorpe Suburban; thence by the River Dove to boundary line between sections 88 and 89, square 6; thence by said boundary to south-eastern angle of section 89; thence in a straight line to south-eastern angle of section 103, square 6; thence by the boundary of said section to the River Motueka; thence along and crossing the said river to the River Baton; thence in a line due west to the dividing range between the East and West Coasts; thence in a straight line to the junction of the Leslie and Karamea; thence in a straight line to Mount Snowdon, the point of starting.

And I do hereby apportion the number of members for the whole of the Motueka District between such sub-Districts as follows:—

The Sub-Districts of Riwaka and Motueka shall each elect two members of the Board for the District.

The sub-Districts of Lower Moutere, Upper Moutere, Pangatotara, and Ngatimoti, shall each elect One member of the Board for the District.

And I do hereby revoke all former Proclamations issued under my hand as such Superintendent, creating Sub-Districts under the said Act within the limits of "The Motueka District," constituted and defined in the *Government Gazette*, No. 17, of the 29th day of June, 1875.
