BY-LAWS passed by the Motueka Highway Board:—

1. Any person or persons guilty of any of the following offences within the limits of the Motueka Highway district shall, on conviction of any such offence, be liable to forfeit and pay any penalty not exceeding the sum of forty shillings for any one offence.
2. No person shall place, or cause to be placed, any obstruction in or upon any roadway, street, footpath, or reserve, by allowing any vehicle or animal to remain in, upon, or across the same, or by placing thereon any goods or material of any kind, or by erecting fences in, upon, or across any roadway, street, footpath, or reserve without having previously obtained the written consent of the Secretary of the Board.
3. No person shall place any obstruction in, upon, or across any ditch, drain, creek, river, or water-course of any kind by throwing therein any material whatsoever.
4. No person shall set fire to any timber, scrub, bush, or other combustible matter which may be liable to damage any road, street, footpath, or reserve.
5. No person shall remove, or cause to be removed, any soil, gravel, sand, stone, or timber from any roadway, street, footpath, or reserve, nor from the bed or banks of any creek or water-course without having previously obtained the written consent of the Secretary of the Board.
6. No person shall permit any cattle to stray or depasture, whether under the tendance or control of any person or persons or not, in or upon any road or street, or the sides thereof, within the limits of the Motueka and Riwaka sub-districts, thereby causing, or being likely to cause, any damage to any such road, street, or to any bridge, hedge, bank, fence, or protective work in connection therewith.
7. The word "cattle" shall, for the purposes of these By-laws, be deemed to include horses, mules, asses, sheep, goats and swine, of all ages and of either sex, and to apply to any

one of such animals as well as to a mob or herd.

8. The words "street, road," shall mean a public road or street used for general traffic.
9. The word "pathway" shall mean all that portion on each side of every street reserved for foot passengers, including a space of ten feet towards the roadway, measured from the line of sections.
10. The occupier, or in case there shall be no occupier, then the owner of any land upon which a gorse or other hedge shall be growing, adjoining any public road, shall, so soon as the portion of the said road adjoining his said land shall be clear, thenceforward keep the same at all times clear of gorse or other obstructions which it may reasonably be supposed have proceeded from the said hedge; and in case such occupier, or owner as the case may be, shall refuse, or neglect to clear such road, after receiving fourteen days' notice in writing to do so from the Secretary of the Board, he shall be liable to forfeit and pay the penalty as expressed in No. 1 of these by-laws.

Proclamation constituting Nelson District Court.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, GOVERNOR.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The District Courts Act, 1858," it is enacted that there shall be within the Colony of New Zealand Courts of Record, possessing Civil and Criminal jurisdiction, to be called District Courts, and the Governor is empowered from time to time, as he shall think fit, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, districts within which such Courts shall be respectively held, and such districts to abolish, and the boundaries thereof to define or alter, and also to declare by what local name such Courts shall be designated:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the aforesaid power and authority, do hereby constitute and proclaim the district of the said Colony hereinafter described or referred to, to be a district within which a District Court shall be held under the said Act and under "The District Courts Act Amendment Act, 1865;"

And in further pursuance and exercise of the authority aforesaid, I do hereby declare that the said Court shall be designated by the name hereunder specified, that is to say,—

Designation of Court:

"The Nelson District Court."

Description of District:

This district is bounded towards the South-east by the boundary of the Province of Nelson, from the sea to the Top House; towards the South by a right line thence to the confluence of the Rotoroa river with the Buller river; thence towards the West by the Westland District, as defined in a Proclamation dated the 10th day of July, 1875; again towards the South by the said district from Mount Arthur to the mouth of the Karamea river, and on all other sides by the sea; together with the adjacent islands.

Proclamation extending Civil Jurisdiction of Nelson District Court.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Districts Courts Jurisdiction Extension Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to bring into operation with respect to any District Court, from and after a day to be named in such Proclamation, either the whole of the said Act or such sections thereof as to him may seem fit:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority vested in me for this purpose, do hereby proclaim and declare that on the eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, the said "District Courts Jurisdiction Extension Act, 1866," shall come into operation with respect to

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The District Courts Criminal Jurisdiction Extension Act, 1870," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, from time to time, declare that any District Court shall have cognizance of all felonies and indictable misdemeanours, as specified in the fourth section of the said Act:

Now therefore I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that

THE NELSON DISTRICT COURT

shall henceforth have cognizance of all felonies and indictable misdemeanours committed before or after the passing of the said Act within the district over which its jurisdiction extends, saving only the felonies specially excepted in and by the fourth clause of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of November, 1875.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The District Courts Act Amendment Act, 1865," it is enacted that the powers conferred on Judges of District Courts in and by the twenty-fifth, twenty-sixth, and twenty-seventh sections of "The District Courts Act, 1858," shall be exercised only within such districts as shall from time to time be named by the Governor, by Order in Council published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, as districts within which such powers may be exercised:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the power and authority so vested in him as aforesaid, doth, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, name and appoint the Nelson District, as defined in and by a certain Proclamation dated the sixth day of November instant, to be a district within which the Judge of the Nelson District Court may exercise the powers conferred by the twenty-fifth, twenty-sixth, and twenty-seventh sections of "The District Courts Act, 1858."
