PROTECTION is hereby granted, under the provisions of the "Goldfields Act, 1866," to Michael French, of Reefton, for the term of two years from the date hereof for a ferry-boat across the left hand branch of the Inangahua River, about one and a half mile from Reefton, subject to the following conditions, viz. :—

1. That a substantial boat shall be placed on the river at the site named, within two months from this date, and maintained in good working order during the term of protection.
2. That a competent ferryman shall always be in attendance, and the ferry shall be at all times conducted to the satisfaction of the Warden of the District.
3. The Warden of the District may, on being satisfied that the ferry is not conducted in an efficient manner, and in accordance with these conditions, suspend the operation of this protection until the matter of complaint be removed, and, if the matter of complaint be not removed within a reasonable time, the Superintendent shall have power to cancel this protection.
4. The tolls to be charged for the use of the ferry-boat shall not exceed the following, viz. :—

5. This protection shall extend along the river for a distance of two miles—that is to say, one mile each side of the site of the ferry.
6. All regulations which may at any time be brought into force under Section 13 of the "Goldfields Act, 1866," shall be deemed applicable to this protection as if it had been granted under the same.
7. This protection shall not be transferred without the sanction of the Superintendent.

RULES for the Management of the MOTUEKA VALLEY CEMETERY, resolved upon at a Meeting of the Trustees held at the Institute, Tadmor, 10th October, 1876.

1. The exclusive right of burial may be purchased at one pound a plot, measuring 10 feet by 5 feet, every additional foot of width to be five shillings.
2. The holders of plots shall observe such rules regarding enclosure and decent maintenance as shall from time to time be prescribed by the Trustees.
3. The fee for interment payable by non-purchasers of plots shall be ten shillings.
4. All applications for exclusive right of burial shall be made to the Clerk of the Board, who is hereby empowered to stake off and give possession of plots; to regulate the digging of graves, and the erection of grave-stones and enclosures; also to receive all fees and charges.
5. Any plot of ground where an interment has already taken place, or any gravestone or enclosure been erected, may be purchased in perpetuity for one pound, such privilege to be exercised before 30th June, 1877.
