For the Hundred of Panmure.—At the Village, on Wednesday, the 28th instant, at two, p.m.

For the Hundred of Otahuhu.—At the Village, on Tuesday, the 27th instant, at two, p.m.

For the Hundred of Howick.—At the Village, on Saturday, the 31st instant at four, p.m.

For the Hundred of Pupuke.—At Mr. Melavin's, near the Roman Catholic College, on Tuesday, the 3rd February next, at four, p.m.

None but personal attendants (being License Holders) at these Meetings will be allowed to vote.

Every such voter will be entitled to one vote for each of the three Wardens, and is requested to bring his License with him, for production, if required.
