**P**ERSONS intending to slaughter Cattle within the District proclaimed by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, are requested to forward notice in writing to the Inspector of Slaughter Houses, of the time and place of such intended slaughtering, or leave the said notice at his residence, near the Public Pound, Hobson's Bridge, Newmarket, agreeably to the provisions of the Slaughter House Ordinance, Victoria 11, Session 8, No. 5.

The penalty for slaughtering Cattle without such notice is five pounds for each and every head of horned or neat cattle so slaughtered.
