AN ORDINANCE TO RESTRICT THE SALE ON SUNDAYS OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS.

<i>Whereas it is expedient to restrict the Sale on Sundays of intoxicating Liquors.</i>	6. Commencement of Operation.
<i>Be it therefore enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of New Plymouth with the Advice and Consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows:—</i>	Twelve o'clock on Saturday nights and Six o'clock on Monday mornings sell any fermented or spirituous liquor, or deliver upon sale any such liquor.
1. No Person shall between the hours of	2. No Person now or at any time hereafter holding a License for the sale of fermented and spirituous liquors, or for the sale of fermented liquors only, shall between the said hours supply or suffer any such

Liquor to be drunk in any Licensed House occupied by him or its appurtenances.

3. Provided that nothing in this Ordinance contained shall extend to prohibit the sale or supply of any such liquor by any person now or at any time hereafter holding any such license as aforesaid to Travellers, or to Persons boarding and lodging in any House licensed for the sale of such liquor, or to prohibit the purchase of any such liquor from on board any vessel in the Roadstead of New Plymouth, or the sale of any such liquor for shipment on board any such vessel.

4. Any person contravening in any respect any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £20.

5. In the construction of this Ordinance the words "sell" and "sale" shall include barter and every other mode of disposal for valuable consideration. And no person resident within 20 miles of the Town of New Plymouth shall for the purposes of this Ordinance be deemed a Traveller.

6. This Ordinance shall come into operation on the 1st day of May 1856.
